Setting the Stage

The Griffins clinched their 19th playoff berth in 29 seasons with a 37-29-4-2 record and 80 points, claiming the third spot in the Central Division, ninth in the Western Conference and 18th overall in the AHL. Grand Rapids will face the second-seeded Texas Stars (43-26-3-0, 89 pts.), who have reached the Central Division Semifinals for the third consecutive season. The Griffins finished the regular-season series against the Stars with a 3-3-2-0 record, including 1-2-1-0 at Van Andel Arena and 2-1-1-0 at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park. After beginning the season series with a four-game point streak (2-0-2-0), the Griffins went on to drop three of the final four meetings (1-3-0-0). The Griffins and Stars have met just once before in the Calder Cup Playoffs, as the eventual Calder Cup champion Texas defeated defending champion Grand Rapids 4-2 in the 2014 Western Conference Semifinals. The Griffins are 2-1 at home and 0-3 on the road against Texas in the postseason. Grand Rapids possesses a 103-86 ledger in the postseason and 21-16 series record, which includes games in the IHL's Turner Cup Playoffs from 1996-01. In the AHL, the Griffins are 86-68 in the postseason, which includes two Calder Cups (2017, 2013). The Griffins have a 7-6 mark in a best-of-five series. This will be Texas' 11th Calder Cup Playoff appearance in 16 seasons, as it has missed the postseason just three times in 2012, 2017, and 2019 (no playoffs in 2020 or 2021). The Stars are 59-47 in postseason games and have a 13-9 series record, having reached the Calder Cup Finals three times (2010, 2014 (won), 2018). Last season, Texas defeated Manitoba 2-0 in the first round before being bested 3-2 by Milwaukee in the Central Division Semifinals.

The Promised Land

On March 29, the Griffins clinched their 19th playoff berth in 29 seasons with a 4-2 Springfield Thunderbirds victory over the Iowa Wild. Grand Rapids returns to the Calder Cup Playoffs for the second consecutive season under head coach **Dan Watson**, after missing the previous two postseasons in 2022 and 2023. The Griffins held at least a share of first place in the Central Division from Nov. 8-Feb. 7 with a 25-15-3-1 mark (.628) through the opening 44 games before finishing the season with a 12-14-1-1 record over the final 28 outings to end up in third place in the division.

Stumbled to the Finish Line

From Nov. 8-Feb. 7, the Griffins held at least a share of first place in the Central Division with a 25-15-3-1 mark (.628) in the first 44 games. The Griffins tied their best start in franchise history with 13 points (6-1-1-0) through the first eight games, previously done in 2000-01 (6-1-1). Grand Rapids also began 3-0-0-0 at home for the first time since 2009-10. However, the team finished the final 28 outings with a 12-14-1-1 record (.464) and ended in third place in the division. The Griffins faltered in the month of March, as they showed a 3-7-1-0 ledger and allowed 4.00 goals per game after allowing 2.43 goals per contest from Oct.-Jan. Grand Rapids ended April with a winning record and concluded the regular season with a 5-4-0-0 record (.556) in the final month.

A Cut Above

There have been 10 different Calder Cup champions since 2011, with Grand Rapids (2017, 2013) and Hershey (2024, 2023) being the only teams to earn multiple championships during that time. The other winners were Chicago (2022), Charlotte (2019), Toronto (2018), Lake Erie (2016), Manchester (2015), Texas (2014), Norfolk (2012) and Binghamton (2011).

Prior History

The Griffins and Stars will renew a rivalry that dates back to the 2009-10 season when Texas joined the AHL. Since the 2009-10 campaign, the teams have met a combined 89 times in the regular season, with the Griffins possessing a 45-31-7-5 record (.573). Grand Rapids and Texas have met just once before in the Calder Cup Playoffs when the defending champion Griffins were defeated 4-2 in the 2014 Western Conference Semifinals to the eventual champion Texas Stars. Current Griffins goalie **Jack Campbell** appeared in four games for the Stars during their cup run and totaled a 2-1 record with a 2.54 GAA and a .917 save percentage. Current Red Wings netminder Petr Mrazek served as Grand Rapids' goaltender in that series. Current assistant coach **Brian Lashoff** played exclusively with Detroit that season and did not face the Stars in 2014. Stars captain Curtis McKenzie is the lone player from 2014 still with the team, while current assistant coach Maxime Fortunus was a player at the time and general manager Scott White was in his fifth season leading the franchise.

Hard to Kill

During the Griffins' franchise-record run of seven straight playoff appearances from 2013-2019, they won two Calder Cups (2013 and 2017), twice lost to the eventual champion (Texas 2014, Lake Erie 2016), and twice lost to the cup runner-up (Utica 2015, Chicago 2019). During their 14 previous AHL playoff runs, they won those pair of cups, lost to the eventual champion on four occasions, and also lost to the other finalist four times. Including their first five seasons as members of the International Hockey League, the Griffins have qualified for the postseason on 19 prior occasions, winning it all twice, losing six times to the eventual champ, and losing four times to the runner-up.

Bench Boss

Second-year head coach **Dan Watson** has made his second straight Calder Cup Playoffs. He is the sixth head coach in franchise history to reach the postseason in both of his first two full years as head coach, joining Bruce Cassidy (2000-02), Danton Cole (2002-04), Greg Ireland (2005-07) Jeff Blashill (2012-14), and Todd Nelson (2015-17). Last postseason, Watson led Grand Rapids to the Central Division Finals, where it lost a winner-take-all Game 5 on the road to the division champion Milwaukee Admirals. Watson was named the Central Division head coach at the 2025 All-Star Classic, becoming the first Griffins coach to achieve an all-star honor since Todd Nelson in 2017 and the fourth head coach in franchise history to coach in an all-star game, joining Nelson, Jeff Blashill (2014), and Bruce Cassidy (2002 AHL, 2001 IHL). Watson has never missed the playoffs during his eight seasons as a head coach. With the ECHL's Toledo Walleye, Watson went 51-34 (.600) over five postseasons, reaching the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023).

From Friend to Foe

The Griffins and Stars share a couple connections on championship winning teams. In 2023, defenseman **Brogan Rafferty** reached the Calder Cup Finals with Coachella Valley alongside Texas' Kole Lind. **Jack Campbell** won the Calder Cup with Texas in 2014 with current Stars Curtis McKenzie, assistant coach Maxime Fortunus and general manager Scott White. In addition, Stars goaltender **Magnus Hellberg** competed for the Griffins in 2022-23, showing a 2-2-0 mark with a 2.50 GAA and a .932 save percentage in four games. Texas equipment manager **Charlie Kaser** is the son of Griffins' broadcaster **Bob Kaser** and served as Grand Rapids' assistant equipment manager from 2018-23. Current Dallas Stars general manager Jim Nill served as the Griffins' GM for two seasons from 2011-13, winning the Calder Cup in 2013. Nill spent parts of 19 seasons with the Detroit Red Wings from 1994-2013, serving as the director of player development (1994-98) and assistant general manager (1998-13) before leaving for Dallas.

Been There, Done That

Jack Campbell (2014 Texas), **Josiah Didier** (2019 Charlotte), assistant coach **Brian Lashoff** (2013 and 2017 Grand Rapids), and **Joe Snively** (2024 & 2023 Hershey) are the Griffins' previous Calder Cup champions. **Brogan Rafferty** (2023 Coachella Valley) made a Calder Cup Finals appearance in 2023. Captain Curtis McKenzie, assistant coach Maxime Fortunus and general manager Scott White all won the Calder Cup with Texas in 2014.

Scouting Texas

The Stars are led by Matej Blumel who showed 72 points (39-33--72) in 67 games, leading the team in points, goals, and power-play goals (11). Blumel, who garnered a spot on the AHL First All-Star Team, ranked among the AHL leaders in goals (1st), points (T2nd), power-play goals (T6th), and shots (274, 1st). On the defensive side of the ice, Kyle Capobianco led all of Texas' blueliners with 50 points (7-43--50), 72 penalty minutes and a plus-25 rating in 64 games. He ranked among the AHL's defensemen leaders in points (T5th), assists (3rd), plus-minus rating (6th), and power-play assists (16, T6th). Remi Poirier and former Griffin Magnus Hellberg split time in net for the Stars. Poirier compiled a 17-11-2 mark with three shutouts (T12th), a 2.50 GAA (13th) and a .908 save percentage (T18th) in 31 games. Hellberg logged a 24-14-1 ledger (wins T4th) with two shutouts, a 2.69 GAA and a .904 save percentage in 41 games (T8th). Justin Hryckowian was named the Dudley (Red) Garrett Memorial Award as the AHL's outstanding rookie, as he led all first-year players with 60 points (22-38--60) in 67 games. Hryckowian's 60 points were the sixth most in the AHL by an undrafted rookie since 2009-10. Texas had the second-best power play at 21.5%, tied for fifth in the AHL with 3.33 goals per game and ranked ninth with 30.36 shots per outing.

The Champs are Here

The Griffins' roster is composed of numerous coaches and players who have either reached a playoff final or won a title for their respective pro, college, junior or national team(s). Most recently, **Joe Snively** won the last two Calder Cups with Hershey (2024, 2023), **Axel Sandin-Pellikka** won the 2024 SHL title with Skelleftea, **Shai Buium** won the 2024 NCAA title with Denver, and **Gabriel Seger** took home the 2024 ECAC title with Cornell University.

Grand Rapids finished the regular season series against Texas with a 3-3-2-0 record, including 1-2-1-0 at Van Andel Arena and 2-1-1-0 at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park...After beginning the season series with a four-game point streak (2-0-2-0), the Griffins went on to drop three of the final four meetings (1-3-0-0)...The Griffins were held to one goal or less in two of the eight games, being shut out on March 26...Six of the eight meetings were decided by two goals or more...Grand Rapids averaged 3.50 goals per game at Texas and just 2.00 goals against the Stars at home...The Stars' power play, which ranked second in the AHL during the regular season (21.5%), went just 2-for-17 (11.8%) against the Griffins...**Joe Snively** led Grand Rapids against Texas with seven points (2-5—7) and five assists in eight games, while Matej Blumel paced the Stars against the Griffins with 11 points (6-5—11) and six goals in eight appearances...Blumel and Arttu Hyry tied for the team lead against Grand Rapids with five assists...**Sheldon Dries** led the Griffins with three goals in six games against Rockford...Leading each team in net were **Jack Campbell**, who went 2-1-0 with a 2.68 GAA and a .905 SV% in three games, and Texas' Magnus Hellberg, who showed a 4-2-0 mark with one shutout, a 2.15 GAA and a .916 SV% in six contests...Campbell secured his first win as a Griffin against Texas on Dec. 17 (20 saves) and made a season-high 35 saves on April 11 versus the Stars...**Antti Tuomisto** registered his 50th pro assist on Feb. 25 at Texas...**Emmitt Finnie** made his season debut on March 26 against Texas...Dries skated in his 300th pro game on Dec. 22 versus the Stars...Snively appeared in his 300th pro game on Feb. 26 at Texas and registered two-point nights against the Stars on Dec. 17 (0-2—2) and Feb. 25 (1-1—2)...**William Wallinder** recorded two assists on April 11 against Texas...**Tim Gettinger** suited up for his 300th AHL game on Dec. 17 at Texas and his 100th game as a Griffin on March 26 versus the Stars...**Ondrej Becher** secured his first two-assist night in the AHL on Feb. 25 at Texas...Captain **Josiah Didier** skated in his 500th pro game on Feb. 25 at Texas...**Amadeus Lombardi** bagged two points (1-1—2) on Feb. 25 at the Stars...**Austin Watson** logged two points (1-1—2) on Dec. 17 at Texas.

DAN WATSON HEAD COACH

The Detroit Red Wings named Dan Watson head coach of the Griffins on June 14, 2023. Watson became the 12th head coach in franchise history after serving six seasons as head coach of the ECHL's Toledo Walleye.

In 2023-24, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the Rockford IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign.

The 44-year-old Watson guided Toledo to a 45-19-5-3 (0.681) record during his final season with the organization in 2022-23 before going 9-4 in the Kelly Cup Playoffs to reach the Western Conference Finals. He has been with the Red Wings organization for the past 15 seasons, holding multiple roles with the Walleye since the team's inception. An assistant coach from 2009-14, he then served two seasons (2014-16) as Toledo's associate head coach alongside head coach Derek Lalonde, who just completed his second season behind the Red Wings' bench. Watson was named head coach in July 2016 and also served as director of hockey operations during the 2020-21 ECHL campaign in which Toledo did not participate due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Watson has never missed the playoffs as head coach, reaching the Calder Cup Playoffs in his debut season last year, the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to three division titles (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), three 100-point seasons (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), two regular season championships (2016-17 and 2021-22), and four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023). In 2016-17, he garnered the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's Coach of the Year in his first year as head coach, when the Walleye won the Central Division behind a franchise-record 51 wins (51-17-2-2, 0.736) and reached the

As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 309-135-30-17 (.677) ledger during the regular season and a 56-38 (.596) mark over only six playoff campaigns (the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19). Last season with the Griffins, Watson coached two AHL All-Star Classic invites in Jonatan Berggren and Simon Edvinsson. Watson has also managed 56 future or former Griffins and nine All-ECHL Team members during his time as Toledo's head coach from 2016-23, including 2023 ECHL Goaltender of the Year John Lethemon. Over his 14-year tenure, Watson helped guide the Walleye to a 523-318-46-36 (.611) regular-season mark and Toledo reached five conference finals and two Kelly Cup Finals, all within the team's last seven playoff runs.

The fastest coach in ECHL history to reach 100 wins and the winningest head coach in Walleye history, Watson was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022.

An undrafted defenseman out of the Ontario Hockey League, Watson signed as a free agent with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000 and began his pro career with the Syracuse Crunch in 2000-01, collecting seven points (3-4—7) in 59 games. Throughout four AHL seasons with Syracuse (2000-03), the Cleveland Barons (2002-04) and Providence Bruins (2003-04), he accumulated 27 points (8-19—27) in 193 appearances.

Watson also saw action in four campaigns at the ECHL level with the Dayton Bombers (2001-02), Long Beach Ice Dogs (2004-06, as captain) and the Toledo Storm (2006-07). Watson, who was named the 2004-05 ECHL Defensive Player of the Year with the Ice Dogs, also competed in the United Hockey League with the Elmira Jackals (2000-01), Columbus Stars (2003-04) and the Kalamazoo Wings (2003-04).

Watson played his junior career with the OHL's Sarnia Sting from 1996-2000 and amassed 59 points (9-50—59) in 212 contests, appearing in the OHL All-Star Game during the 1998-99 season.

Watson and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kenzi and Eilee, and a son, Max.

STEPH JULIEN
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Steph Julien as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season with the Griffins in 2023-24, he helped guide the team to its best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. Julien then helped the Griffins reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

During the 2022-23 season, Julien was named the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) Coach of the Year as well as the QMJHL General Manager of the Year when he helped lead the Sherbrooke Phoenix to a Central Division title and a trip to the QMJHL semifinals with a 50-13-3-2 (0.772) regular-season record. Julien also guided Canada's U18 squad to a gold medal at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup as head coach and earned another gold medal as an assistant for Team Canada at the 2023 World Junior Championship.

In 2022, Julien coached Canada's Black U17 squad to a third-place finish at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He began his national coaching career in 2017 when he served as an assistant coach for Team Canada at the 2017 World Junior Championship, earning a silver medal.

Before joining the Griffins, Julien had spent his entire coaching career with Sherbrooke, serving as an assistant coach from 2012-16 before being named head coach midway through the 2015-16 campaign. The Shawinigan, Quebec, native garnered his first QMJHL Coach of the Year recognition during the 2019-20 campaign when Sherbrooke won the QMJHL regular-season title with a 51-8-3-1 mark (0.841). As head boss, Julien notched a 262-161-24-17 record (0.609) with three division titles and one league championship.

In 2022-23, Tyson Hinds was named the QMJHL Top Defensemen while Ethan Gauthier was named the QMJHL Top Pro Prospect under the guidance of Julien. He also propelled Joshua Roy to the top scorer in the QMJHL during the 2021-22 campaign with 119 points (51-68—119) in 66 games. In total, Julien has served as head coach for three QMJHL First All-Star Team members, four second-team honorees and three honorable mentions.

Julien also served as general manager for Sherbrooke for the past three campaigns (2020-23), accumulating a 104-47-6-6 ledger (0.675). In 2022-23, when he was named the QMJHL General Manager of the Year, Julien acquired goaltender Olivier Adam, forwards Jakub Brabenec and Jacob Melanson, and defenseman Marc-Andre Gaudet. Adam went on to show a 20-3-1 record along with a 2.09 GAA, while the skaters combined for 125 points (41-84—125) in 93 games.

The QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 1994-95 with the Sherbrooke Faucons, Julien was twice named a QMJHL First Team All-Star (1992-93 and 1994-95) and was selected a Second Team All-Star in 1993-94. The 49-year-old went on to collect 667 points (205-462—667) in 775 professional games from 1995-2012, playing the majority of his career overseas in Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Switzerland. He competed in one pro season in the United States with the Pensacola Ice Pilots of the ECHL, collecting 38 points (13-25—38) and 91 penalty minutes in 69 outings in 1996-97. He spent the most time in the DEL, the top hockey league in Germany, playing nine seasons and serving as captain for EHC München in the final two campaigns of his pro career from 2010-12.

Julien and his wife, Isabelle, have two daughters. Aurelie, 25, works as a nurse while Gabrielle, 23, serves as a teacher. Julien's wife, Isabelle, works as a philanthropy development director at Hospital CHUS back home in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

BRIAN LASHOFF
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Brian Lashoff as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season in the coaching ranks, Lashoff helped guide the Griffins to their best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. He then helped the team reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

The 34-year-old spent all or part of 14 seasons (2008-13; 2014-23) on the Griffins' blue line during his playing career, including the final three years as the team's captain, and seven campaigns (2012-15; 2016-20) with the Detroit Red Wings. Lashoff was a key component of Grand Rapids' Calder Cup championship teams in both 2013 and 2017, joining Nathan Paetsch and Mitch Callahan as the franchise's only two-time cup champions. He served as a playing captain at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, marking his first career all-star nod, and he won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2010 World Junior Championship.

The Albany, New York, native ranks second on the Griffins' all-time games played list with 628, compiling 132 points (32-100—132) and 329 penalty minutes. He's one of only four defensemen and 12 skaters to record 100 career assists for Grand Rapids, and only two Griffins blueliners have tallied more than his 132 points (Richards 238, Paetsch 142).

Lashoff has also contributed 20 points (5-15—20) and 34 PIM in 75 playoff games for Grand Rapids, marking the second-most postseason appearances in Griffins history (Paetsch 78). He also ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with two unassisted goals (T1st) and one shorthanded goal (T1st).

Lashoff became the 126th Griffins alumnus to play in the NHL when he made his debut with Detroit on Jan. 21, 2013 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, scoring a goal in the process. The defensemen accumulated 15 points (2-13—15) in 136 regular-season NHL games and logged another eight contests during the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Including a three-game stint with the ECHL's Toledo Walleye during his first full pro season in 2010-11, Lashoff played his entire career within the Red Wings organization after making his pro debut with the Griffins in 2008-09 at the age of 18. After playing junior hockey with Kingston and Barrie of the Ontario Hockey League, the undrafted Lashoff suited up for 767 professional regular-season games and registered 148 points (34-114—148) and 394 PIM.

Lashoff resides in Ada with his wife Nicolina and daughter Maeve.

ROOPE KOISTINEN

GOALTENDING COACH

The Detroit Red Wings on July 3, 2023, announced the hiring of Roope Koistinen as the goaltending coach of the Griffins.

In his first season with the team in 2023-24, Koistinen coached Sebastian Cossa to a 22-9-9 record with two shutouts to go along with a 2.41 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Under Koistinen's guidance, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in GAA (T6th) and save percentage (T13th) and set a new franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6) from Jan. 19-April 5, 2024.

Koistinen had been with Karpat's youth programs in Finland from 2014-23, serving in multiple roles for the club. In 2022-23, Karpat U20 allowed the third-fewest goals in the SM-sarja U20 league in Finland with 48 goals allowed in 23 outings (2.09 GAA) with Koistinen as its goaltending coach. The 30-year-old also garnered a 2023 U17 World Hockey Challenge bronze medal with Team Finland, serving as the team's goaltending coach. As an assistant coach for Finland's U17 team, he collected another bronze medal at the 2023 European Youth Olympic Winter Festival.

From 2015-23, the Kiiminki, Finland, native served as the goaltending coach for Karpat's U18 and U20 clubs in addition to his director of goaltending development title with Karpat. In 2018-19, Koistinen helped guide Karpat U20 to a U20 SM-liiga championship as its goaltending coach with a 32-13-5-2 ledger and just 121 goals allowed (2.33 GAA), the fewest in the league by 17 goals. In total from 2015-23, Koistinen won three league titles, four silver medals and two bronze medals with Karpat's youth programs. Under Koistinen's guidance, Justus Annunen (COL) won the 2018 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie award, Joel Blomqvist (PIT) claimed the 2020 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie award, Leevi Merilainen (OTT) was named to the 2021 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team, and Niklas Kokko (SEA) was honored on the 2022 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team.

Koistinen has also been part of Finland's coaching staff for its youth national teams since the 2018-19 season. He served as goaltending coach for Finland U16 from 2018-19 and 2021-22, before earning a spot as goaltending coach for Finland U17 from 2019-20 and 2022-23. In 2020-21, Koistinen finished in fourth place as Finland's goaltending coach at the 2021 U18 World Championship.

Koistinen spent his entire playing career with KKP's youth teams in Finland. He began his career in 2008-09 with KKP U17 in the U17 SM-sarja division in Finland, posting a 4.11 goals against average in 15 appearances. Koistinen competed in his final season during the 2013-14 campaign with KKP U20 in the U20 Aluedivisioona league, compiling a 3.50 GAA and a 0.921 save percentage in two appearances.

ERICH JUNGE

Erich Junge will embark on his third season as the video coach for the Grand Rapids Griffins, helping the staff prepare, evaluate and assess their game both as a team and as individuals.

A native of Ballwin, Missouri, Junge served as a volunteer assistant coach at Bemidji State University during the 2021-22 season. Junge helped guide the Beavers to the CCHA Playoff championship game before being bested by No. 1 ranked Minnesota State, 2-1 in overtime.

Prior to joining Bemidji State, Junge spent the 2020-21 campaign as the volunteer director of player development for Ohio University. The 26-year-old also served as the video coach for Ohio for four seasons from 2016-20.

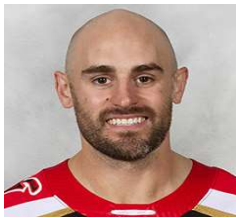

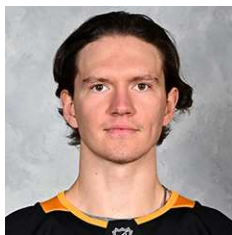
