Griffins at Wolves

Fifth of eight meetings overall, third of four at Allstate Arena...This weekend marks the first time in franchise history that the Griffins will play a 3-in-3 against one opponent...Grand Rapids has faced Chicago 206 times in the regular season dating back to their IHL days, the second-most of any Griffins opponent (Milwaukee, 222)...The Griffins have strung together back-to-back winning seasons against Chicago (10-5-1-2, .639) for the first time since 2015-17 (14-3-1-0, .806)...The Wolves 2-6-1-0 at home compared to 6-3-1-0 on the road this year...The Griffins are 7-3-1-0 on the road this season...Since the 2020-21 season, Grand Rapids is just 16-24-2-2 (.409) against the Wolves and has been outscored 161-119. Also since the 2020-21 season, the Griffins are 8-14-0-0 (.364) against the Wolves in Chicago and have been outscored 89-59...The Wolves rank 31st in the AHL with a power-play percentage of 10.6%, while their penalty kill ranks 28th at 77.1%...Chicago ranks 29th on the circuit with 2.58 goals scored per game and 16th with 3.00 goals against per game...The Wolves allow the second-fewest shots per game in the AHL at 25.5 and produce the 12th best shot rate at 30.0.

Last Time Out

Elmer Soderblom lit the lamp in overtime to give the Griffins a 5-4 victory over the Chicago Wolves on Saturday at Allstate Arena. Soderblom (1–1—2), Sheldon Dries (1-1—2) and Dominik Shine (0-2—2) all tallied two-point outings alongside Brogan Rafferty (1-1—2) who returned from injury. Austin Watson extended his point streak to three (2-1—3) when he found the back of the net and Tim Gettinger scored his first goal of the year. Carter Gylander improved to 2-1-0 in the campaign and saved 23 shots.

This Date in Griffins History

2002: In a first-of-its-kind event, every Griffins player and coach takes turns skating with fans for one hour each, around the clock, as part of "The Great Skate." Held outdoors at Rosa Parks Circle in downtown Grand Rapids, the event raises \$12,000 for the Griffins Youth Foundation.

Keep The Good Times Rolling

With a 15-6-1-0 record and 31 points through 22 games, the Griffins rank first in the Central Division, second in the Western Conference and fifth in the AHL. This marks the first time that Grand Rapids has been atop the division in December or later since the 2018-19 season, when it held a share of first place as late as March 8. When Dec. 1 dawned last season, the Griffins were tied for fourth place with a 6-8-1-1 record. In 29 seasons, this was the fourth Griffins team to win at least 10 of its first 14 games, and the first since 2009-10. The Griffins have won with defense, as they have allowed two goals or less in 12 of the 22 contests and have scored an average of 3.14 goals per game (13th).

Busy Bodies

The Griffins will finish their second consecutive weekend of three games in three days. Grand Rapids is a combined 5-1-0-0 during its two previous weekends of 3-in-3s with its only loss coming against Chicago. With all three games coming against the Wolves this week, this marks the first time in franchise history that the Griffins will play a 3-in-3 against one opponent. Grand Rapids played three straight games against Chicago from April 22-28, 2022 (0-3-0-0). The Griffins went 3-0-0-0 in their first 3-in-3 from Oct. 25-27, defeating Springfield and Lehigh Valley (twice). This was the first time since April 5-7, 2002 that Grand Rapids went undefeated while playing three games in three days.

He Shoots, He Scores

Through the first 10 games of the season, the Griffins scored more than two goals just three times and averaged 2.20 goals per game, which ranked 29th in the AHL as of Nov. 4. Since then, Grand Rapids has scored at least four goals in eight of the last 12 contests, averaging 3.92 goals per game. The Griffins are 13th on the circuit with 3.14 goals per outing while placing second in goals against per game (2.50). When scoring at least three goals this season, Grand Rapids is 12-0-0-0.

Damn Daniel, Back At It Again

Rookie **Nate Danielson**, selected ninth overall by Detroit in 2023, had just two points (1-1—2) in his first eight games as a pro. However, he enjoyed a team-high four-game point streak (1-4—5) from Nov. 24-Dec. 1 and has nine points (2-7—9) in his last 10 contests. The 20-year-old made his pro debut with Grand Rapids on May 20 at Milwaukee during the Calder Cup Playoffs and finished the postseason with two appearances. Prior to turning pro, Danielson spent four campaigns in the WHL and amassed 217 points (83-134—217) in 199 regular-season games.

No Ordinary Joe

Newcomer **Joe Snively** enjoyed team-high four-game goal streak from Nov. 13-22 and has 10 points (7-3—10) in his last 12 outings. Snively is tied for second on the roster in both points (8-8—16) and goals (8) through 22 appearances. The Herndon, Virginia, native joined the Griffins after a historic run with the Hershey Bears the last two seasons. Snively won the last two Calder Cups with the Bears and showed a combined 33 points (6-27—33) in 40 games during the postseason with a 28-12 record in the past two playoffs. Snively also aided Hershey to a regular-season title last year with a 53-14-0-5 mark (111 pts., .771), the second-best regular-season record in AHL history and the most wins by an AHL team in a 72-game season. The 28-year-old is in search of his third straight Calder Cup, as only 11 players in league history have won three consecutive cups in the AHL and no one has achieved this feat since the 1978 season.

Regain Power

The Griffins' power play struggled out of the gate but has now converted seven of its last 22 opportunities on the man-advantage (31.8%) and has scored a power-play goal in five of the last six games. The power play ranks 15th on the circuit at 18.1% (13-for-72). If you break it down further, Grand Rapids' home power play is 6-for-30 (20.0%, 11th) and its road power play is 7-for-42 (16.7%, T18th). The Griffins' penalty kill ranks second in the AHL at 89.5% and their four short-handed goals are tied for third. Grand Rapids recorded two short-handed goals in 3:24 of game time on Nov. 7 at lowa, which equaled the number of short-handed tallies it had in 72 games last season. The last time the Griffins had scored two short-handed goals in a game was in a 5-3 win over Ontario on Feb. 5, 2022.

Veteran Presence

Sheldon Dries (415), Dominik Shine (444), Joe Snively (269) and Austin Watson (772) bring a combined 1,900 games worth of experience to the Griffins' locker room. The group has also produced a lot of the scoring for the team this season. Watson has five points in his last six games (4-1—5), Shine has six in his last four (2-4—6), Snively with four points in his last four games (2-2—4), and Dries with five points (2-3—5) in his last four outings. With a combined 63 points, the foursome is responsible for 35.6% of the total offense produced by the Griffins this year.

Give Me Some Fin

Finnish prospect defensemen **Antti Tuomisto** and **Eemil Viro** have excelled this season and it's starting to show in the box score. Tuomisto posted a career-high three assists on Nov. 24 against the lowa Wild and now has five points (1-4—5) in his last four outings. Viro, not known for his offensive production, logged assists in back-to-back appearances from Nov. 29-30. Viro was selected 70th overall by Detroit in 2020 while Tuomisto was the Red Wings' 35th overall pick in 2019.

Let's Show Some Love to the Defense

The Griffins rank second in the AHL with just 2.50 goals allowed per game, as the 55 goals surrendered are tied for sixth in the AHL. Dating back to last season, Grand Rapids has allowed just 27 goals in its last 14 regular-season games at Van Andel Arena (1.93 GA per game).

One, Two Punch

Sebastian Cossa, the 15th overall pick by the Detroit Red Wings in 2021, is off to a strong start through the opening 14 games of his season, showing a 9-4-1 mark with one shutout, a 2.21 goals-against average, and a .925 save percentage. The 22-year-old ranks among the league leaders in minutes played (816:02, 4th), shutouts (T7th), GAA (7th), wins (3rd), and save percentage (7th). Ville Husso has also gotten off to a fast start with the Griffins, as he has a 4-0-0 ledger with one shutout to go along with a 1.58 goals-against average and a .944 save percentage in five appearances. Through six career games with Grand Rapids, Husso has a 5-0-0 record with two shutouts, a 1.29 goals-against average and a .953 save percentage. Jack Campbell joined the goaltending room on Nov. 18 when he was assigned by the Red Wings and made his Griffins debut on Dec. 6 against Chicago, collecting 29 saves in a 3-1 defeat. Campbell, the 11th overall pick by Dallas in 2010, has appeared in 438 games since 2011-12 and possesses a 229-141-47 ledger with 32 shutouts to go along with a 2.67 goals-against average. Last season, the 32-year-old showed an 18-13-1 record, a 2.63 goals-against average and a .918 save percentage in 33 games with the Bakersfield Condors. Husso was recalled by Detroit last Wednesday and Cossa was recalled on Monday on emergency conditions. Carter Gylander has been reassigned from Toledo to Grand Rapids by Detroit. The Griffins' goalie room currently consists of Campbell and Gylander.

Shoot Your Shot

On Nov. 15 against Chicago, the Griffins outshot their opponent for the first time in the opening 14 games of the season and have now outshot their opponent just four times in the first 22 contests. The Griffins have averaged 24.8 shots per game, which ranks last in the AHL. Grand Rapids has been held to under 20 shots five times and has exceeded 30 shots four times. On the flip side, the Griffins' opponents have averaged 30.1 shots per game (20th in AHL) and have been held to under 30 shots eight times. The third period has given the Griffins the most problems, as they are being outshot 210-149 compared to being outshot 215-206 in the second and 225-179 in the first. However, Grand Rapids has a 9-3-1-0 ledger when recording 20-29 shots and a 9-4-1-0 mark when allowing 30-39 shots.

If You Ain't First, You're Last

Starting the game off on the right foot has been imperative for the Griffins early this season. Grand Rapids is 11-1-1-0 when scoring the game's first goal and 13-1-1-0 when either tied or leading after the first period. When the Griffins allow the first goal they are 4-5-0-0, and 2-5-0-0 when trailing after two periods.

DAN WATSON HEAD COACH

The Detroit Red Wings named Dan Watson head coach of the Griffins on June 14, 2023. Watson became the 12th head coach in franchise history after serving six seasons as head coach of the ECHL's Toledo Walleye.

In 2023-24, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the Rockford IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign.

The 44-year-old Watson guided Toledo to a 45-19-5-3 (0.681) record during his final season with the organization in 2022-23 before going 9-4 in the Kelly Cup Playoffs to reach the Western Conference Finals. He has been with the Red Wings organization for the past 15 seasons, holding multiple roles with the Walleye since the team's inception. An assistant coach from 2009-14, he then served two seasons (2014-16) as Toledo's associate head coach alongside head coach Derek Lalonde, who just completed his second season behind the Red Wings' bench. Watson was named head coach in July 2016 and also served as director of hockey operations during the 2020-21 ECHL campaign in which Toledo did not participate due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Watson has never missed the playoffs as head coach, reaching the Calder Cup Playoffs in his debut season last year, the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to three division titles (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), three 100-point seasons (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), two regular season championships (2016-17 and 2021-22), and four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023). In 2016-17, he garnered the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's Coach of the Year in his first year as head coach, when the Walleye won the Central Division behind a franchise-record 51 wins (51-17-2-2, 0.736) and reached the As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 309-135-30-17 (.677) ledger during the regular season and a 56-38 (.596) mark over only six playoff campaigns (the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19). Last season with the Griffins, Watson coached two AHL All-Star Classic invites in Jonatan Berggren and Simon Edvinsson. Watson has also managed 56 future or former Griffins and nine All-ECHL Team members during his time as Toledo's head coach from 2016-23, including 2023 ECHL Goaltender of the Year John Lethemon. Over his 14-year tenure, Watson helped guide the Walleye to a 523-318-46-36 (.611) regular-season mark and Toledo reached five conference finals and two Kelly Cup Finals, all within the team's last seven playoff runs.

The fastest coach in ECHL history to reach 100 wins and the winningest head coach in Walleye history, Watson was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022.

An undrafted defenseman out of the Ontario Hockey League, Watson signed as a free agent with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000 and began his pro career with the Syracuse Crunch in 2000-01, collecting seven points (3-4—7) in 59 games. Throughout four AHL seasons with Syracuse (2000-03), the Cleveland Barons (2002-04) and Providence Bruins (2003-04), he accumulated 27 points (8-19—27) in 193 appearances.

Watson also saw action in four campaigns at the ECHL level with the Dayton Bombers (2001-02), Long Beach Ice Dogs (2004-06, as captain) and the Toledo Storm (2006-07). Watson, who was named the 2004-05 ECHL Defensive Player of the Year with the Ice Dogs, also competed in the United Hockey League with the Elmira Jackals (2000-01), Columbus Stars (2003-04) and the Kalamazoo Wings (2003-04).

Watson played his junior career with the OHL's Sarnia Sting from 1996-2000 and amassed 59 points (9-50—59) in 212 contests, appearing in the OHL All-Star Game during the 1998-99 season.

Watson and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kenzi and Eilee, and a son, Max.

STEPH JULIEN ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Steph Julien as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season with the Griffins in 2023-24, he helped guide the team to its best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. Julien then helped the Griffins reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

During the 2022-23 season, Julien was named the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) Coach of the Year as well as the QMJHL General Manager of the Year when he helped lead the Sherbrooke Phoenix to a Central Division title and a trip to the QMJHL semifinals with a 50-13-3-2 (0.772) regular-season record. Julien also guided Canada's U18 squad to a gold medal at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup as head coach and earned another gold medal as an assistant for Team Canada at the 2023 World Junior Championship.

In 2022, Julien coached Canada's Black U17 squad to a third-place finish at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He began his national coaching career in 2017 when he served as an assistant coach for Team Canada at the 2017 World Junior Championship, earning a silver medal.

Before joining the Griffins, Julien had spent his entire coaching career with Sherbrooke, serving as an assistant coach from 2012-16 before being named head coach midway through the 2015-16 campaign. The Shawinigan, Quebec, native garnered his first QMJHL Coach of the Year recognition during the 2019-20 campaign when Sherbrooke won the QMJHL regular-season title with a 51-8-3-1 mark (0.841). As head boss, Julien notched a 262-161-24-17 record (0.609) with three division titles and one league championship.

In 2022-23, Tyson Hinds was named the QMJHL Top Defensemen while Ethan Gauthier was named the QMJHL Top Pro Prospect under the guidance of Julien. He also propelled Joshua Roy to the top scorer in the QMJHL during the 2021-22 campaign with 119 points (51-68—119) in 66 games. In total, Julien has served as head coach for three QMJHL First All-Star Team members, four second-team honorees and three honorable mentions.

Julien also served as general manager for Sherbrooke for the past three campaigns (2020-23), accumulating a 104-47-6-6 ledger (0.675). In 2022-23, when he was named the QMJHL General Manager of the Year, Julien acquired goaltender Olivier Adam, forwards Jakub Brabenec and Jacob Melanson, and defenseman Marc-Andre Gaudet. Adam went on to show a 20-3-1 record along with a 2.09 GAA, while the skaters combined for 125 points (41-84—125) in 93 games.

The QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 1994-95 with the Sherbrooke Faucons, Julien was twice named a QMJHL First Team All-Star (1992-93 and 1994-95) and was selected a Second Team All-Star in 1993-94. The 49-year-old went on to collect 667 points (205-462—667) in 775 professional games from 1995-2012, playing the majority of his career overseas in Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Switzerland. He competed in one pro season in the United States with the Pensacola Ice Pilots of the ECHL, collecting 38 points (13-25—38) and 91 penalty minutes in 69 outings in 1996-97. He spent the most time in the DEL, the top hockey league in Germany, playing nine seasons and serving as captain for EHC München in the final two campaigns of his pro career from 2010-12.

Julien and his wife, Isabelle, have two daughters. Aurelie, 25, works as a nurse while Gabrielle, 23, serves as a teacher. Julien's wife, Isabelle, works as a philanthropy development director at Hospital CHUS back home in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

BRIAN LASHOFF ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Brian Lashoff as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season in the coaching ranks, Lashoff helped guide the Griffins to their best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. He then helped the team reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

The 34-year-old spent all or part of 14 seasons (2008-13; 2014-23) on the Griffins' blue line during his playing career, including the final three years as the team's captain, and seven campaigns (2012-15; 2016-20) with the Detroit Red Wings. Lashoff was a key component of Grand Rapids' Calder Cup championship teams in both 2013 and 2017, joining Nathan Paetsch and Mitch Callahan as the franchise's only two-time cup champions. He served as a playing captain at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, marking his first career all-star nod, and he won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2010 World Junior Championship.

The Albany, New York, native ranks second on the Griffins' all-time games played list with 628, compiling 132 points (32-100—132) and 329 penalty minutes. He's one of only four defensemen and 12 skaters to record 100 career assists for Grand Rapids, and only two Griffins blueliners have tallied more than his 132 points (Richards 238, Paetsch 142).

Lashoff has also contributed 20 points (5-15—20) and 34 PIM in 75 playoff games for Grand Rapids, marking the second-most postseason appearances in Griffins history (Paetsch 78). He also ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with two unassisted goals (T1st) and one shorthanded goal (T1st).

Lashoff became the 126th Griffins alumnus to play in the NHL when he made his debut with Detroit on Jan. 21, 2013 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, scoring a goal in the process. The defensemen accumulated 15 points (2-13—15) in 136 regular-season NHL games and logged another eight contests during the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Including a three-game stint with the ECHL's Toledo Walleye during his first full pro season in 2010-11, Lashoff played his entire career within the Red Wings organization after making his pro debut with the Griffins in 2008-09 at the age of 18. After playing junior hockey with Kingston and Barrie of the Ontario Hockey League, the undrafted Lashoff suited up for 767 professional regular-season games and registered 148 points (34-114—148) and 394 PIM.

Lashoff resides in Ada with his wife Nicolina and daughter Maeve.

ROOPE KOISTINEN GOALTENDING COACH

The Detroit Red Wings on July 3, 2023, announced the hiring of Roope Koistinen as the goaltending coach of the Griffins.

In his first season with the team in 2023-24, Koistinen coached Sebastian Cossa to a 22-9-9 record with two shutouts to go along with a 2.41 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Under Koistinen's guidance, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in GAA (T6th) and save percentage (T13th) and set a new franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6) from Jan. 19-April 5, 2024.

Koistinen had been with Karpat's youth programs in Finland from 2014-23, serving in multiple roles for the club. In 2022-23, Karpat U20 allowed the third-fewest goals in the SM-sarja U20 league in Finland with 48 goals allowed in 23 outings (2.09 GAA) with Koistinen as its goaltending coach. The 30-year-old also garnered a 2023 U17 World Hockey Challenge bronze medal with Team Finland, serving as the team's goaltending coach. As an assistant coach for Finland's U17 team, he collected another bronze medal at the 2023 European Youth Olympic Winter Festival.

From 2015-23, the Kiiminki, Finland, native served as the goaltending coach for Karpat's U18 and U20 clubs in addition to his director of goaltending development title with Karpat. In 2018-19, Koistinen helped guide Karpat U20 to a U20 SM-liiga championship as its goaltending coach with a 32-13-5-2 ledger and just 121 goals allowed (2.33 GAA), the fewest in the league by 17 goals. In total from 2015-23, Koistinen won three league titles, four silver medals and two bronze medals with Karpat's youth programs. Under Koistinen's guidance, Justus Annunen (COL) won the 2018 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie award, Joel Blomqvist (PIT) claimed the 2020 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie award, Leevi Merilainen (OTT) was named to the 2021 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team, and Niklas Kokko (SEA) was honored on the 2022 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team.

Koistinen has also been part of Finland's coaching staff for its youth national teams since the 2018-19 season. He served as goaltending coach for Finland U16 from 2018-19 and 2021-22, before earning a spot as goaltending coach for Finland U17 from 2019-20 and 2022-23. In 2020-21, Koistinen finished in fourth place as Finland's goaltending coach at the 2021 U18 World Championship.

Koistinen spent his entire playing career with KKP's youth teams in Finland. He began his career in 2008-09 with KKP U17 in the U17 SM-sarja division in Finland, posting a 4.11 goals against average in 15 appearances. Koistinen competed in his final season during the 2013-14 campaign with KKP U20 in the U20 Aluedivisioona league, compiling a 3.50 GAA and a 0.921 save percentage in two appearances.

ERICH JUNGE VIDEO COACH

Erich Junge will embark on his third season as the video coach for the Grand Rapids Griffins, helping the staff prepare, evaluate and assess their game both as a team and as individuals.

A native of Ballwin, Missouri, Junge served as a volunteer assistant coach at Bemidji State University during the 2021-22 season. Junge helped guide the Beavers to the CCHA Playoff championship game before being bested by No. 1 ranked Minnesota State, 2-1 in overtime.

Prior to joining Bemidji State, Junge spent the 2020-21 campaign as the volunteer director of player development for Ohio University. The 26-year-old also served as the video coach for Ohio for four seasons from 2016-20.
