#### Monsters at Griffins

Fourth of eight meetings overall, fourth of four at Van Andel Arena...Grand Rapids has points in 28 out of the last 36 games overall (20-8-4-4, .667) against Cleveland...In the last five seasons since 2021-22, the Griffins are 19-8-4-4 (.657) against Cleveland and have outscored them 107-96. At home during that span, Grand Rapids has lost just twice in regulation against the Monsters (12-2-3-2, .763) with a plus-25 scoring margin (70-45)...The Monsters are 8-1-1-0 in their last 10 games and are on a two-game winning streak...The Griffins are 6-4-0-0 in their last 10 contests and are on a three-game win streak...Cleveland is 14-9-2-0 on the road this season compared to 11-6-4-1 at home...Grand Rapids is 19-5-1-0 at home compared to 18-2-1-1 on the road...Cleveland's power play is tied for 20th in the AHL at 17.9% and its penalty kill places 11th at 81.9%...Cleveland ranks 20th with 2.96 goals per game and tied for 13th with 3.02 goals against per game...The Monsters rank eighth with 29.1 shots per game and third with 25.8 shots allowed...The Monsters are led by Luca Del Bel Belluz with 40 points (13-27—40) in 35 games. In net, Ivan Fedotov leads the way with a 2.85 GAA and an .888 save percentage in 32 games (17-9-4). In the AHL rankings, Fedotov is tied for sixth in wins and tied for second in games played...Head coach **Dan Watson** suited up for the Cleveland Barons from 2002-04 and calls Cleveland home during the offseason...**Tyler Angle** skated with the Monsters from 2020-24, logging 100 points (41-59—100) in 200 games. He also suited up for four games with the Columbus Blue Jackets from 2022-24, collecting one goal.

#### Last Time Out

With his second hat trick of the season, **Dominik Shine** surpassed Mitch Callahan for the third-most goals in franchise history (95), as the Griffins shut out the Texas Stars 5-0 at Van Andel Arena on Sunday. **Sebastian Cossa**'s 26-save shutout and fifth of the season became the most by a Griffin since Jared Coreau in 2015-16. Grand Rapids' league-best record stood at 37-7-2-1 through 47 games (77 pts.), while boosting its home record to 19-5-1-0. **Amadeus Lombardi**, **Antti Tuomisto**, and **Sheldon Dries** each tallied an assist to extend their point streaks to three, while **Shai Buium** notched his first goal of the season and his fifth point in three games (1-4—5). The Griffins improved to 27-0 when potting the game's first goal.

#### This Date in Griffins History

1997: Grand Rapids hosts the 1997 IHL All-Star Game before a sold-out throng at Van Andel Arena. **Pokey Reddick**, **Michel Picard**, and **Jeff Nelson** represent the Griffins on the Eastern Conference squad, but it's the Western Conference that claims a 6-4 victory.

#### Shine On, Captain

**Dominik Shine** was named the Howies Hockey Tape/AHL Player of the Week for the period ending Feb. 15, 2026, when he logged five goals, 13 shots and a plus-six rating in two games. He also began the week competing in his first-career AHL All-Star Classic in Rockford, Illinois. In last Sunday's 5-0 win against Texas, Shine collected his second hat trick of the season and surpassed Mitch Callahan for the third-most goals in franchise history (95), securing his first-ever 20-goal campaign. This marks Shine's first-career AHL Player of the Week award, as he continues his 10th season as a Griffin. The 32-year-old has 34 points (20-14—34) in 34 games with 32 penalty minutes and a career-high plus-22 rating, ranking second on the team in points, goals and plus-minus rating. In the AHL rankings, the Detroit native is tied for 11th in goals and ninth in plus-minus rating. On the all-time regular-season franchise leaderboard, Shine ranks third in games played (517), third in goals (95), seventh in assists (123), fourth in points (218), fifth in penalty minutes (585), tied for fifth in shorthanded goals (6), tied for third in game-winners (15), tied for first in unassisted goals (10), and third in shots (888).

## Back in the Groove

The Griffins dropped six of 10 games from Jan. 7-30 but have since returned to form, showing a 5-1-0-0 record with a plus-13 margin (24-11) from Jan. 31-Feb. 15. Grand Rapids has scored five goals in four of its last six contests and has allowed more than two goals just once. The Griffins have continued their league-record start with a 37-7-2-1 ledger and 77 points through 47 games. Grand Rapids tied the 2005-06 Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins (34-6-3-2, 73 pts.) for the second-best start in AHL history through 45 games. The team saw its franchise-record tying 15-game win streak from Nov. 22-Dec. 27 come to an end in overtime on Dec. 31, which also tied for the sixth-longest run in AHL history. In addition, the Griffins' 19-game point streak from Nov. 22-Jan. 7 (18-0-1-0) ended on Jan. 9, which tied for the longest run in franchise history (see table). The Griffins are 18-2-1-1 on the road and 19-5-1-0 at home. The 17-game points streak on the road from Oct. 10-Jan. 23 (15-0-1-1) set a new AHL record, eclipsing the 2010-11 Milwaukee Admirals' 16-game run (10-0-4-2). Grand Rapids ranks first in the AHL in points (77), has a 19-point cushion over Chicago for first place in the Central Division, and is 37 points up on a playoff spot.

## The Brick Wall

**Sebastian Cossa**, the 15th overall pick in 2021, collected his fifth shutout of the season last Sunday against Texas with 26 saves. His career-high five shutouts are the most by a Griffin since 2015-16 (Jared Coreau). Cossa has a 21-4-2 record with a 1.92 goals-against average and a .930 save percentage. He enjoyed a career-high 10-game win streak from Nov. 25-Dec. 27, showing a 1.51 GAA and a .939 save percentage, and a 14-game point streak from Nov. 25-Jan. 13 (12-0-2). In the AHL rankings, Cossa ranks second in GAA, second in save percentage, first in shutouts, tied for first in wins and eighth in minutes played (1595:01). Cossa won two straight AHL Goaltender of the Month awards (November and December), becoming the first netminder in franchise history to receive the honor twice in the same season. The 23-year-old also became just the third goaltender in team history to win the award twice in any fashion, joining Jared Coreau (Feb. 2018, Dec. 2015) and Jimmy Howard (Dec. 2007, March 2006). In parts of four seasons with Grand Rapids since 2022-23, Cossa has notched a 65-29-16 mark with eight shutouts to go along with a 2.37 GAA and a .914 save percentage in 111 outings, becoming just the sixth netminder to reach the century mark with the team.

## Record Setters

- Franchise record for fewest shots in a game (10) on Jan. 17 versus Milwaukee

## What's The Password?

The Griffins' defense remains the best in the AHL, as it ranks first with 1.91 goals allowed per contest. Grand Rapids posted its eighth shutout of the season on Feb. 15 against Texas, which are the most since 2016-17 (8). The Griffins shut out their opponent in two straight games from Jan. 17-21 in addition to posting consecutive shutouts from Dec. 21-27. Prior to this season, the last time Grand Rapids logged two straight shutouts was Feb. 15-17, 2018. The Griffins have allowed more than two goals just 12 times all season (25.5%) and have averaged 1.80 goals allowed in their last five outings. In addition, the team's penalty kill is first in the AHL at 87.2%. In net, **Sebastian Cossa** sports a 1.92 GAA with a .930 save percentage and five shutouts, while rookie netminder **Michal Postava** possesses a 1.77 GAA, a .936 save percentage and two shutouts. Grand Rapids also has three of the top eight plus-minus ratings among defensemen. The Griffins have four defensemen who have played at least 100 games in the NHL in **Erik Gustafsson** (517) (currently with Detroit), **Justin Holl** (396), **Ian Mitchell** (110), and **William Lagesson** (107), totaling 1,130 appearances.

## Back to Normal

Grand Rapids was held to under three goals in seven of nine games from Jan. 9-30 but has since scored five goals in four of its last six contests since Jan. 31, averaging 4.00 goals per game. The Griffins have returned to first in the AHL with 3.51 goals per game after a slow January. The team has outscored its opponents 165-90 and is 27-0 when scoring the game's first goal. The Griffins have outscored their opponents 76-43 at home, while possessing an 89-47 advantage on the road. Grand Rapids has its largest scoring margin against its opponents in the third period (67-29). **John Leonard** leads the team and ranks second in the AHL with 26 goals, while **Dominik Shine** ranks second on the roster with 20 and **Eduards Tralmaks** places third with 18.

## Sha-BOO-ya

Second-year defenseman **Shai Buium** collected two assists in consecutive games from Feb. 7-13 and followed that with his first goal of the season last Sunday. The 22-year-old has five points (1-4—5) in his last three outings and six points (1-5—6) in the past five contests since Feb. 3. Buium, the 36th overall pick by Detroit in 2021, made his season debut on Jan. 9 against Texas after rehabbing an upper-body injury suffered during the NHL preseason. As a rookie last season, Buium registered 25 points (2-23—25), 22 penalty minutes and a plus-two rating in 67 regular-season games, adding three appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs. Buium spent his collegiate career at the University of Denver from 2021-24, becoming a two-time NCAA champion in 2021-22 and 2023-24.

## Leaders of the Pack

The Griffins have led the Central Division for the entire season, and are 19 points above second-place Chicago and 37 points up on a playoff spot. Grand Rapids is 29-5-2-1 against its division rivals and has outscored them 133-73, suffering its first regulation defeat against the division on Jan. 9 against Texas. The Griffins' 29 wins are the most divisional victories since 2023-24 (30). Nineteen of the remaining 25 games for Grand Rapids will be against the Central Division (76.0%). The Griffins will see the most games against the Milwaukee Admirals (5) and Rockford IceHogs (5).

## The Well is not Dry

**Sheldon Dries** is on a three-game point streak (1-2—3) and had goals in three of four games from Jan. 31-Feb. 7. Throughout 39 games with this season, Dries has 33 points (17-16—33) and a career-high plus-18 rating. The Macomb, Michigan, native ranks third on the roster in points, fourth in assists, and fourth in goals. He had two points in four straight games from Dec. 17-27 (3-5—8) and was selected as the Howies Hockey Tape/AHL Player of the Week for the period ending Dec. 21 when he logged six points (2-4—6) and a plus-eight rating in three games. Throughout his nine-year AHL career, Dries has 277 points (155-122—277), 270 penalty minutes and a plus-45 rating in 378 games.

## Sparkling Stars

**Amadeus Lombardi** is on a three-game point streak (1-2—3) and has seven points (3-4—7) in his last seven outings. He tied his career high with three points (1-2—3) on Jan. 31 at Chicago. This marked the second time he's posted three points this season and was his fourth multi-point outing of the campaign. The third-year pro was sidelined for 20 straight games from Nov. 22-Jan. 9 due to rehabbing an injury. Since his return on Jan. 13, Lombardi has nine points (3-6—9) in 14 games. Last season, the Aurora, Ontario, native, logged a career-high 40 points (19-21—40) in 44 games with the Griffins. With Grand Rapids since the spring of 2023, Lombardi has 90 points (30-60—90) in 143 outings. He was the 113th overall pick by the Detroit Red Wings in the 2022 NHL Entry Draft.

## Going for Gold

On Jan. 6, Team Latvia announced that forward **Eduards Tralmaks** will represent the country at the Milan Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games from Feb. 6-22. Tralmaks finished the Olympics with four points (3-1—4), six penalty minutes and a plus-one rating in four games, pacing the team in points. Tralmaks is the seventh player to participate in an Olympics while playing for the Griffins (see table). Tralmaks is also the sixth current or former Griffin competing at the Olympics, joining USA's Dylan Larkin, Germany's Moritz Seider, Czechia's Filip Hronek and Radim Simek, and Slovakia's Tomas Tatar. Tralmaks, a native of Riga, Latvia, has 24 points (18-6—24), six penalty minutes and a plus-19 rating in 44 games with the Griffins this season. When he joined Team Latvia, he ranked among the Griffins leaders in goals (2nd), points (5th), and plus-minus rating (T2nd), while tying for 14th in the AHL in goals and plus-minus rating. Tralmaks has competed for Team Latvia at the two previous World Championships in 2024 and 2025, showing a combined nine points (4-5—9) in 14 games. At last year's World Championship, Tralmaks led Latvia in points (3-4—7) and assists, while ranking second in goals in seven games. Also in 2024-25, he potted one goal in three Olympic qualifying games with Latvia.

## Just Getting Started

Rookie netminder **Michal Postava** tied a franchise record by becoming the 10th netminder in team history to post back-to-back shutouts from Jan. 17-21. He collected his first AHL shutout on Jan. 17 with 10 saves in a 2-0 victory over Milwaukee and followed that performance with a 19-save blanking of Milwaukee on Jan. 21. His 10 saves on Jan. 17 set a new franchise record for fewest in a shutout. Postava logged a shutout streak of 156:20 from Jan. 9-25, which was 3:47 short of breaking the franchise record by Jared Coreau in 2014-15 (160:06). After beginning the campaign 5-0, the 23-year-old suffered his first AHL defeat on Jan. 9 against Texas. Postava is now 9-3-0 with a 1.77 goals-against average and a .936 save percentage in 14 games. Last season, Postava became a Czech Extraliga champion with Kometa Brno, showing a league-best .940 save percentage with a 1.97 GAA and a 10-7 record in 17 playoff games. During the regular season with Kometa Brno, Postava ranked among the Czech Extraliga leaders in save percentage (.921, 5th), GAA (2.39, 11th), wins (23, 4th), games played (42, T2nd) and shutouts (3, T7th). As an undrafted free agent, Postava signed a two-year, entry-level contract with the Detroit Red Wings last summer.

**DAN WATSON**  
**HEAD COACH**

The Detroit Red Wings named Dan Watson head coach of the Griffins on June 14, 2023. Watson became the 12th head coach in franchise history after serving six seasons as head coach of the ECHL's Toledo Walleye.

In 2024-25, Watson became the sixth head coach in franchise history to reach the postseason in both of his first two full years, joining Bruce Cassidy (2000-02), Danton Cole (2002-04), Greg Ireland (2005-07), Jeff Blashill (2012-14), and Todd Nelson (2015-17). Watson was also named the Central Division head coach at the AHL All-Star Classic, becoming the first Griffin coach to achieve an all-star honor since Todd Nelson in 2017 and the fourth head coach in franchise history to coach in an all-star game, joining Nelson, Blashill (2014), and Cassidy (2002 AHL, 2001 IHL). Watson concluded the 2024-25 regular season with a third-place finish in the Central Division, sporting a 37-29-4-2 mark.

In 2023-24, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the Rockford IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign.

The 46-year-old Watson guided Toledo to a 45-19-5-3 (0.681) record during his final season with the organization in 2022-23 before going 9-4 in the Kelly Cup Playoffs to reach the Western Conference Finals. He has been with the Red Wings organization for the past 16 seasons, holding multiple roles with the Walleye since the team's inception. An assistant coach from 2009-14, he then served two seasons (2014-16) as Toledo's associate head coach alongside head coach Derek Lalonde. Watson was named head coach in July 2016 and also served as director of hockey operations during the 2020-21 ECHL campaign in which Toledo did not participate due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Watson has never missed the playoffs as head coach, reaching the Calder Cup Playoffs twice (2024 and 2025), the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to three division titles (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), three 100-point seasons (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), two regular season championships (2016-17 and 2021-22), and four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023). In 2016-17, he garnered the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's Coach of the

As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 346-164-34-19 (.662) ledger during the regular season and a 56-41 (.577) mark over only seven playoff campaigns (the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19). In two seasons with the Griffins, Watson has coached four AHL All-Star Classic invites in Sebastian Cossa (2025), Austin Watson (2025), Jonatan Berggren (2024) and Simon Edvinsson (2024). Watson has also managed 56 future or former Griffins and nine All-ECHL Team members during his time as Toledo's head coach from 2016-23, including 2023 ECHL Goaltender of the Year John Lethemon. Over his 14-year tenure, Watson helped guide the Walleye to a 523-318-46-36 (.611) regular-season mark and Toledo reached five conference finals and two Kelly Cup Finals, all within the team's last seven playoff runs.

The fastest coach in ECHL history to reach 100 wins and the winningest head coach in Walleye history, Watson was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022.

An undrafted defenseman out of the Ontario Hockey League, Watson signed as a free agent with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000 and began his pro career with the Syracuse Crunch in 2000-01, collecting seven points (3-4—7) in 59 games. Throughout four AHL seasons with Syracuse (2000-03), the Cleveland Barons (2002-04) and Providence Bruins (2003-04), he accumulated 27 points (8-19—27) in 193 appearances.

Watson also saw action in four campaigns at the ECHL level with the Dayton Bombers (2001-02), Long Beach Ice Dogs (2004-06, as captain) and Toledo Storm (2006-07). Watson, who was named the 2004-05 ECHL Defensive Player of the Year with the Ice Dogs, also competed in the United Hockey League with the Elmira Jackals (2000-01), Columbus Stars (2003-04) and the Kalamazoo Wings (2003-04).

Watson played his junior career with the OHL's Sarnia Sting from 1996-2000 and amassed 59 points (9-50—59) in 212 contests, appearing in the OHL All-Star Game during the 1998-99 season.

Watson and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kenzi and Eilee, and a son, Max.

**STEPH JULIEN**  
**ASSISTANT COACH**

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Steph Julien as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

Last campaign, Julien aided the Griffins to a third-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-29-4-2 mark, reaching the division semifinals for the second consecutive campaign. In his first season with the Griffins in 2023-24, he helped guide the team to its best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. Julien then helped the Griffins reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

During the 2022-23 season, Julien was named the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) Coach of the Year as well as the QMJHL General Manager of the Year when he helped lead the Sherbrooke Phoenix to a Central Division title and a trip to the QMJHL semifinals with a 50-13-3-2 (0.772) regular-season record. Julien also guided Canada's U18 squad to a gold medal at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup as head coach and earned another gold medal as an assistant for Team Canada at the 2023 World Junior Championship.

In 2022, Julien coached Canada's Black U17 squad to a third-place finish at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He began his national coaching career in 2017 when he served as an assistant coach for Team Canada at the 2017 World Junior Championship, earning a silver medal.

Before joining the Griffins, Julien had spent his entire coaching career with Sherbrooke, serving as an assistant coach from 2012-16 before being named head coach midway through the 2015-16 campaign. The Shawinigan, Quebec, native garnered his first QMJHL Coach of the Year recognition during the 2019-20 campaign when Sherbrooke won the QMJHL regular-season title with a 51-8-3-1 mark (0.841). As head boss, Julien notched a 262-161-24-17 record (.609) with three division titles and one league championship.

In 2022-23, Tyson Hinds was named the QMJHL Top Defensemen while Ethan Gauthier was named the QMJHL Top Pro Prospect under the guidance of Julien. He also propelled Joshua Roy to the top scorer in the QMJHL during the 2021-22 campaign with 119 points (51-68—119) in 66 games. In total, Julien has served as head coach for three QMJHL First All-Star Team members, four second-team honorees and three honorable mentions.

Julien also served as general manager for Sherbrooke for three campaigns (2020-23), accumulating a 104-47-6-6 ledger (.675). In 2022-23, when he was named the QMJHL General Manager of the Year, Julien acquired goaltender Olivier Adam, forwards Jakub Brabenec and Jacob Melanson, and defenseman Marc-Andre Gaudet. Adam went on to show a 20-3-1 record along with a 2.09 GAA, while the skaters combined for 125 points (41-84—125) in 93 games.

The QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 1994-95 with the Sherbrooke Faucons, Julien was twice named a QMJHL First Team All-Star (1992-93 and 1994-95) and was selected a Second Team All-Star in 1993-94. The 49-year-old went on to collect 667 points (205-462—667) in 775 professional games from 1995-2012, playing the majority of his career overseas in Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Switzerland. He competed in one pro season in the United States with the Pensacola Ice Pilots of the ECHL, collecting 38 points (13-25—38) and 91 penalty minutes in 69 outings in 1996-97. He spent the most time in the DEL, the top hockey league in Germany, playing nine seasons and serving as captain for EHC München in the final two campaigns of his pro career from 2010-12.

Julien and his wife, Isabelle, have two daughters. Aurelie, 25, works as a nurse while Gabrielle, 23, serves as a teacher. Julien's wife, Isabelle, works as a philanthropy development director at Hospital CHUS back home in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

**BRIAN LASHOFF**  
**ASSISTANT COACH**

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Brian Lashoff as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

Last campaign, Lashoff aided the Griffins to a third-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-29-4-2 mark, reaching the division semifinals for the second straight year. In his first season in the coaching ranks in 2023-24, Lashoff helped guide the Griffins to their best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. He then helped the team reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

Lashoff spent all or part of 14 seasons (2008-13; 2014-23) on the Griffins' blue line during his playing career, including the final three years as the team's captain, and seven campaigns (2012-15; 2016-20) with the Detroit Red Wings. Lashoff was a key component of Grand Rapids' Calder Cup championship teams in both 2013 and 2017, joining Nathan Paetsch and Mitch Callahan as the franchise's only two-time cup champions. He served as a playing captain at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, marking his first career all-star nod, and he won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2010 World Junior Championship.

The Albany, New York, native ranks second on the Griffins' all-time games played list with 628, compiling 132 points (32-100—132) and 329 penalty minutes. He's one of only four defensemen and 13 skaters to record 100 career assists for Grand Rapids, and only two Griffins blueliners have tallied more than his 132 points (Richards 238, Paetsch 142). Lashoff also contributed 20 points (5-15—20) and 34 PIM in 75 playoff games for Grand Rapids, marking the second-most postseason appearances in Griffins history (Paetsch 78). He ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with two unassisted goals (T1st) and one shorthanded goal (T1st).

Lashoff became the 126th Griffins alumnus to play in the NHL when he made his debut with Detroit on Jan. 21, 2013 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, scoring a goal in the process. The defensemen accumulated 15 points (2-13—15) in 136 regular-season NHL games and logged another eight contests during the Stanley Cup Playoffs. Including a three-game stint with the ECHL's Toledo Walleye during his first full pro season in 2010-11, Lashoff played his entire career within the Red Wings organization after making his pro debut with the Griffins in 2008-09 at the age of 18.

After playing junior hockey with Kingston and Barrie of the Ontario Hockey League, the undrafted Lashoff suited up for 767 professional regular-season games and registered 148 points (34-114—148) and 394 PIM.

Lashoff resides in Ada with his wife Nicolina and daughter Maeve.

**ROOPE KOISTINEN**  
**GOALTENDING COACH**

The Detroit Red Wings on July 3, 2023, announced the hiring of Roope Koistinen as the goaltending coach of the Griffins.

Last campaign, Koistinen aided goaltender Sebastian Cossa to a 21-15-5 record with a 2.45 goals-against average and a .911 save percentage, as the netminder earned his first-ever AHL All-Star Classic appearance. In 2024-25 with the help of Koistinen, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in games played (41, T8th), wins (21, T10th), GAA (2.45, 11th), and save percentage (.911, T13th). In his first season with the team in 2023-24, Koistinen coached Cossa to a 22-9-9 record with two shutouts to go along with a 2.41 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Under Koistinen's guidance, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in GAA (2.41, T6th) and save percentage (.913, T13th), and set a new franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6) from Jan. 19-April 5, 2024.

Koistinen had been with Karpat's youth programs in Finland from 2014-23, serving in multiple roles for the club. In 2022-23, Karpat U20 allowed the third-fewest goals in the SM-sarja U20 league in Finland with 48 goals allowed in 23 outings (2.09 GAA) with Koistinen as its goaltending coach. He also garnered a 2023 U17 World Hockey Challenge bronze medal with Team Finland, serving as the team's goaltending coach. As an assistant coach for Finland's U17 team, he collected another bronze medal at the 2023 European Youth Olympic Winter Festival.

From 2015-23, the Kiiminki, Finland, native served as the goaltending coach for Karpat's U18 and U20 clubs in addition to his director of goaltending development title with Karpat. In 2018-19, Koistinen helped guide Karpat U20 to a U20 SM-liiga championship as its goaltending coach with a 32-13-5-2 ledger and just 121 goals allowed (2.33 GAA), the fewest in the league by 17 goals. In total from 2015-23, Koistinen won three league titles, four silver medals and two bronze medals with Karpat's youth programs. Under Koistinen's guidance, Justus Annunen (NSH) won the 2018 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie award, Joel Blomqvist (PIT) claimed the 2020 U20 SM-sarja Best Goalie achievement, Leevi Merilainen (OTT) was named to the 2021 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team, and Niklas Kokko (SEA) was honored on the 2022 U20 SM-sarja Second All-Star Team.

Koistinen has also been part of Finland's coaching staff for its youth national teams since the 2018-19 season. He served as goaltending coach for Finland U16 from 2018-19 and 2021-22, before earning a spot as goaltending coach for Finland U17 from 2019-20 and 2022-23. In 2020-21, Koistinen finished in fourth place as Finland's goaltending coach at the 2021 U18 World Championship.

Koistinen spent his entire playing career with KKP's youth teams in Finland. He began his career in 2008-09 with KKP U17 in the U17 SM-sarja division in Finland, posting a 4.11 goals against average in 15 appearances. Koistinen competed in his final season during the 2013-14 campaign with KKP U20 in the U20 Aluedivisioona league, compiling a 3.50 GAA and a 0.921 save percentage in two appearances.
