Wolves at Griffins

Sixth of eight meetings overall, third of four at Van Andel Arena...Grand Rapids has faced Chicago 207 times in the regular season dating back to their IHL days, the second-most of any Griffins opponent (Milwaukee, 224)...The Griffins have strung together back-to-back winning seasons against Chicago (10-5-1-2, .639) for the first time since 2015-17 (14-3-1-0, .806)...Grand Rapids has lost three of the last four games against Chicago (1-3-0-0)...Chicago went 10-2-1-0 from Dec. 1-Jan. 4 but since that run it has lost three straight entering the week, having allowed five goals in each lose...The Wolves 9-6-1-0 on the road compared to 8-7-1-0 at home this year...The Griffins are 9-6-1-0 at home this season and have just one win in their last six home games (1-4-1-0)...Chicago is 6-4-0-0 in its last 10 games and Grand Rapids is 4-4-2-0 in its last 10...Since the 2020-21 season, Grand Rapids is just 16-25-2-2 (.400) against the Wolves and has been outscored 163-120. Also since the 2020-21 season, the Griffins are 8-10-2-2 (.455) against the Wolves at Van Andel Arena and have been outscored 72-60...The Wolves rank last in the AHL with a power-play percentage of 12.8%, while their penalty kill ranks 25th at 78.7%...Chicago ranks 22nd on the circuit with 2.84 goals scored per game and 14th with 2.94 goals against per game...The Wolves allow the third-fewest shots per game in the AHL at 26.2 and produce the seventh-best shot rate at 31.0...Chicago's Justin Robidas is tied for ninth among rookies with 22 points (9-13—22). Wolves' netminder Spencer Martin ranks seventh with a 2.16 GAA and is tied for eighth with a .918 save percentage...Defenseman **Tory Dello** skated in 65 games with Chicago last season and logged 13 points (3-10—13)...Defenseman **Brogan Rafferty** hails from West Dundee, Illinois, which is about 45 minutes from Chicago.

Last Time Out

Following nearly 60 minutes of scoreless hockey, the Manitoba Moose struck with 35 seconds remaining, handing the Griffins a 1-0 loss on Saturday at Van Andel Arena. Nine of the last 12 meetings between Grand Rapids and Manitoba have been decided by one goal, including all four matchups this year. Despite the loss, goaltender **Jack Campbell** turned away 26 shots, improving to a .932 save percentage and a 1.82 goals-against average in his five appearances this season (2-3-0). Since returning from the holiday break, the Griffins' defense has held their opponents to just 1.33 goals per game. However, the offense has averaged just one goal per game in its last four outings. The loss marked the first time the Griffins were shut out this season.

This Date in Griffins History

2000: Grand Rapids beats Orlando 4-1, giving the Griffins the most wins (26) and best winning percentage (0.688) in the IHL at the All-Star break.

Ups and Downs

The Griffins returned from the holiday break with a 3-0-0-0 record in their first three games but have since gone on to drop their last three outings, which is tied for the longest losing streak this season. The defense has been solid once again, allowing just 1.33 goals since the break. However, the offense has averaged just 2.33 goals per game since the break and just one goal per game in its last four outings. Grand Rapids is now tied for first place in the Central Division, tied for second in the Western Conference, and tied for sixth in the AHL with a 20-12-3-0 record and 43 points through 35 games. The Griffins are 12-10-2-0 against their division rivals and have held at least a share of the top spot in the division since Nov. 8.

Home Sweet Home

On Jan. 4, the Griffins finished a stretch of games that saw them play nine of 12 contests on the road from Dec. 7-Jan. 4 and showed a 6-4-2-0 record. Grand Rapids is now in a season-high five-game homestand that began last Friday and in a stretch that will see it play eight of its next 10 games inside Van Andel Arena from Jan. 10-Feb. 1. The Griffins are 9-6-1-0 at home this season but have won just one of their last six home outings (1-4-1-0). Under head coach **Dan Watson**, Grand Rapids is 32-13-5-2 (.683) inside Van Andel Arena.

Elm Tree

Elmer Soderblom, the tallest player in franchise history at 6-foot-8, registered two points (1-1—2) last Friday against Manitoba and now has five points in his last seven outings (2-3—5). During his two-point night last weekend, the 23-year-old bagged his 50th point as a Griffin (21-29—50) in his 115th outing with the team. Last year, Soderblom produced 29 points (13-16—29) in 61 contests before adding two points (1-1—2) in seven playoff games, making his Calder Cup Playoff debut on May 3, 2024 against Rockford. The Gothenburg, Sweden, native also appeared in 21 games with the Detroit Red Wings during his rookie season in 2022-23 and totaled eight points (5-3—8) in 21 games.

Shine Bright

Veteran **Dominik Shine** is tied for first on the roster in points (10-15—25) and third in assists (15) and goals (10) in 35 games. Shine collected his sixth multi-point game of the season on Dec. 7 at Chicago (0-2—2), which tied for his career-high mark set in 2021-22, and now has six points (4-2—6) in his last 10 contests. Last year, Shine posted career-high numbers in assists (23), points (33) and plus-minus rating (+8) and is on pace to reach 52 points (21-31—52) this season. The Detroit native has spent his entire career with Grand Rapids since 2016-17 and has accumulated 163 points (71-92—163) and 511 penalty minutes in 457 appearances. He is one goal shy of breaking into the top 10 for goals scored in franchise history. In the Griffins' all-time rankings, Shine places third in games played, sixth in penalty minutes, tied for 10th in overtime goals (2), and tied for first in unassisted goals (10).

Rollercoaster Ride

The Griffins ranked 29th in the AHL through the first 10 games with 2.20 goals per contest before showing 4.10 goals per game from Nov. 7-Dec. 1 and going 8-2-0-0 during the run. The Griffins then averaged just 2.33 goals per game from Dec. 6-22 and went 3-4-2-0 in those contests. Grand Rapids has now potted 14 goals across six games (2.33) since Dec. 28 with a 3-3-0-0 record and just one goal per game on average in its last four contests. The Griffins are tied for 24th on the circuit with 2.80 goals per outing, while ranking first in goals against per game (2.43). When scoring at least three goals this season, Grand Rapids is 16-0-0-0 compared to 4-12-3-0 when scoring fewer than three goals.

Power Outage

The Griffins have been held without a power-play goal in four straight games (0-for-14) and have converted just three of their last 21 power-play opportunities (14.3%) during their last seven games. Grand Rapids had its best run when it scored a power-play goal in five straight games from Nov. 24-Dec. 6 (5-for-15, 33.3%). The power play is tied for 22nd on the circuit at 16.4% (20-for-122). If you break it down further, Grand Rapids' home power play is 8-for-49 (16.3%, 21st) and its road power play is 12-for-73 (16.4%, 18th). The Griffins have also given up five short-handed goals, which is tied for the seventh-most. The Griffins' penalty kill has also struggled as of late, allowing a power-play goal in three straight games (9-for-13 on PK, 69.2%). Grand Rapids has also surrendered a power-play goal in 10 of its last 15 outings (44-for-56 on PK, 78.6%). However, the penalty-kill unit remains one of the best in the league, as it ranks eighth at 85.1%. Grand Rapids has scored five short-handed tallies this season, which is tied for fifth in the AHL. When scoring on the power play, the Griffins are 11-4-2-0 and 5-9-1-0 when they allow a power-play goal.

Lock It Down

The Griffins have allowed just 1.33 goals per game since returning from the holiday break and rank first overall with 2.43 goals allowed per game this season. **Sebastian Cossa** has shown a 2.34 goals-against average and .917 save percentage through 20 games, while **Jack Campbell** has logged a 1.82 goals-against average and a .932 save percentage in five appearances. Dating back to last season, Grand Rapids has allowed just 41 goals in its last 19 regular-season games at Van Andel Arena (2.16 GA per game). Also dating back to last season, the Griffins have allowed 54 goals in their last 21 regular-season road games (2.57 GA per game).

Holy Goalies

Sebastian Cossa, the 15th overall pick by the Detroit Red Wings in 2021, has been the go-to netminder for the Griffins this season, as he has a 10-7-3 mark with a 2.34 GAA and a .917 save percentage in 20 games. Cossa ranks among the AHL leaders in minutes played (1,178:10, 9th), games played (20, T9th), GAA (8th), wins (T12th), and save percentage (10th). The 22-year-old collected his first NHL victory during his debut on Dec. 9 at the Buffalo Sabres with a 6-5 shootout victory behind 12 saves and two stops in the shootout. Cossa became the first netminder in NHL history to win his debut via a shootout in a relief effort. Veteran **Jack Campbell** made his Griffins debut on Dec. 6 against the Chicago Wolves and later bagged his first win as a Griffin on Dec. 17 at Texas behind 20 saves in a 4-2 decision. Through five games with Grand Rapids, Campbell is 2-3-0 with a stellar 1.82 goals-against average and a .932 save percentage. Campbell has 443 pro games under his belt with a 2.66 GAA and 231 wins since 2011-12, splitting time between the NHL (176 GP), AHL (240 GP) and ECHL (27 GP). In the AHL, Campbell has shown a 119-85-26 record with a 2.70 goals-against average and a .911 save percentage.

Pucks On Net

The Griffins outshot their opponent just three times in the first 21 contests (14.3%) but have since outshot their opponent five times in the last 14 games (35.7%). Grand Rapids held a shot advantage in two straight games from Jan. 2-4, a feat its only done two other times this season (Dec. 7-8; Nov. 24-29). The Griffins average 25.4 shots per game, which ranks last in the AHL. Grand Rapids has been held to under 20 shots six times and has exceeded 30 shots eight times. On the flip side, the Griffins' opponents average 28.7 shots per game (16th in AHL) and have been held to under 30 shots 17 times. The third period has given the Griffins the most problems, as they are being outshot 311-254 compared to being outshot 334-309 in the second and 339-308 in the first. However, Grand Rapids has a 12-7-2-0 ledger when recording 20-29 shots and an 11-5-2-0 mark when allowing 30-39 shots.

Written In The Stars

Goaltender **Sebastian Cossa**, forward **Austin Watson**, and head coach **Dan Watson** will represent the Griffins at this year's AHL All-Star Classic to be held Feb. 2-3 at Acrisure Arena in Palm Desert, California. Cossa, who is in his second full season with the Griffins, will make his first appearance in the AHL All-Star Classic and the first for a Griffins goalie since Petr Mrazek in 2013. The 15th overall pick by the Detroit Red Wings in 2021 ranks among the AHL's leaders in minutes played (1,178:10, 9th), games played (20, T9th), GAA (2.34, 8th), wins (10, T12th), and save percentage (.917, 10th). Austin Watson, a 13-year veteran, will also make his first AHL All-Star Classic appearance. The Ann Arbor, Michigan, native is tied for first on the roster with 25 points (9-16—25) in 33 games, while also tying for the team lead in assists (16) and power-play goals (4). Dan Watson is the first Griffins coach to achieve an all-star honor since Todd Nelson in 2017 and the fourth head coach in franchise history to coach in an all-star game, joining Nelson, Jeff Blashill (2014), and Bruce Cassidy (2002 AHL, 2001 IHL). This will mark Watson's third career all-star appearance, as he was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022 while with the Toledo Walleye.

DAN WATSON HEAD COACH

The Detroit Red Wings named Dan Watson head coach of the Griffins on June 14, 2023. Watson became the 12th head coach in franchise history after serving six seasons as head coach of the ECHL's Toledo Walleye.

In 2023-24, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the Rockford IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign.

The 44-year-old Watson guided Toledo to a 45-19-5-3 (0.681) record during his final season with the organization in 2022-23 before going 9-4 in the Kelly Cup Playoffs to reach the Western Conference Finals. He has been with the Red Wings organization for the past 15 seasons, holding multiple roles with the Walleye since the team's inception. An assistant coach from 2009-14, he then served two seasons (2014-16) as Toledo's associate head coach alongside head coach Derek Lalonde, who just completed his second season behind the Red Wings' bench. Watson was named head coach in July 2016 and also served as director of hockey operations during the 2020-21 ECHL campaign in which Toledo did not participate due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Watson has never missed the playoffs as head coach, reaching the Calder Cup Playoffs in his debut season last year, the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to three division titles (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), three 100-point seasons (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), two regular season championships (2016-17 and 2021-22), and four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023). In 2016-17, he garnered the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's Coach of the Year in his first year as head coach, when the Walleye won the Central Division behind a franchise-record 51 wins (51-17-2-2, 0.736) and reached the

As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 309-135-30-17 (.677) ledger during the regular season and a 56-38 (.596) mark over only six playoff campaigns (the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19). Last season with the Griffins, Watson coached two AHL All-Star Classic invites in Jonatan Berggren and Simon Edvinsson. Watson has also managed 56 future or former Griffins and nine All-ECHL Team members during his time as Toledo's head coach from 2016-23, including 2023 ECHL Goaltender of the Year John Lethemon. Over his 14-year tenure, Watson helped guide the Walleye to a 523-318-46-36 (.611) regular-season mark and Toledo reached five conference finals and two Kelly Cup Finals, all within the team's last seven playoff runs.

The fastest coach in ECHL history to reach 100 wins and the winningest head coach in Walleye history, Watson was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022.

An undrafted defenseman out of the Ontario Hockey League, Watson signed as a free agent with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000 and began his pro career with the Syracuse Crunch in 2000-01, collecting seven points (3-4—7) in 59 games. Throughout four AHL seasons with Syracuse (2000-03), the Cleveland Barons (2002-04) and Providence Bruins (2003-04), he accumulated 27 points (8-19—27) in 193 appearances.

Watson also saw action in four campaigns at the ECHL level with the Dayton Bombers (2001-02), Long Beach Ice Dogs (2004-06, as captain) and the Toledo Storm (2006-07). Watson, who was named the 2004-05 ECHL Defensive Player of the Year with the Ice Dogs, also competed in the United Hockey League with the Elmira Jackals (2000-01), Columbus Stars (2003-04) and the Kalamazoo Wings (2003-04).

Watson played his junior career with the OHL's Sarnia Sting from 1996-2000 and amassed 59 points (9-50—59) in 212 contests, appearing in the OHL All-Star Game during the 1998-99 season.

Watson and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kenzi and Eilee, and a son, Max.

STEPH JULIEN
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Steph Julien as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season with the Griffins in 2023-24, he helped guide the team to its best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. Julien then helped the Griffins reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

During the 2022-23 season, Julien was named the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) Coach of the Year as well as the QMJHL General Manager of the Year when he helped lead the Sherbrooke Phoenix to a Central Division title and a trip to the QMJHL semifinals with a 50-13-3-2 (0.772) regular-season record. Julien also guided Canada's U18 squad to a gold medal at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup as head coach and earned another gold medal as an assistant for Team Canada at the 2023 World Junior Championship.

In 2022, Julien coached Canada's Black U17 squad to a third-place finish at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He began his national coaching career in 2017 when he served as an assistant coach for Team Canada at the 2017 World Junior Championship, earning a silver medal.

Before joining the Griffins, Julien had spent his entire coaching career with Sherbrooke, serving as an assistant coach from 2012-16 before being named head coach midway through the 2015-16 campaign. The Shawinigan, Quebec, native garnered his first QMJHL Coach of the Year recognition during the 2019-20 campaign when Sherbrooke won the QMJHL regular-season title with a 51-8-3-1 mark (0.841). As head boss, Julien notched a 262-161-24-17 record (0.609) with three division titles and one league championship.

In 2022-23, Tyson Hinds was named the QMJHL Top Defensemen while Ethan Gauthier was named the QMJHL Top Pro Prospect under the guidance of Julien. He also propelled Joshua Roy to the top scorer in the QMJHL during the 2021-22 campaign with 119 points (51-68—119) in 66 games. In total, Julien has served as head coach for three QMJHL First All-Star Team members, four second-team honorees and three honorable mentions.

Julien also served as general manager for Sherbrooke for the past three campaigns (2020-23), accumulating a 104-47-6-6 ledger (0.675). In 2022-23, when he was named the QMJHL General Manager of the Year, Julien acquired goaltender Olivier Adam, forwards Jakub Brabenec and Jacob Melanson, and defenseman Marc-Andre Gaudet. Adam went on to show a 20-3-1 record along with a 2.09 GAA, while the skaters combined for 125 points (41-84—125) in 93 games.

The QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 1994-95 with the Sherbrooke Faucons, Julien was twice named a QMJHL First Team All-Star (1992-93 and 1994-95) and was selected a Second Team All-Star in 1993-94. The 49-year-old went on to collect 667 points (205-462—667) in 775 professional games from 1995-2012, playing the majority of his career overseas in Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Switzerland. He competed in one pro season in the United States with the Pensacola Ice Pilots of the ECHL, collecting 38 points (13-25—38) and 91 penalty minutes in 69 outings in 1996-97. He spent the most time in the DEL, the top hockey league in Germany, playing nine seasons and serving as captain for EHC München in the final two campaigns of his pro career from 2010-12.

Julien and his wife, Isabelle, have two daughters. Aurelie, 25, works as a nurse while Gabrielle, 23, serves as a teacher. Julien's wife, Isabelle, works as a philanthropy development director at Hospital CHUS back home in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

BRIAN LASHOFF
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Brian Lashoff as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season in the coaching ranks, Lashoff helped guide the Griffins to their best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. He then helped the team reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

The 34-year-old spent all or part of 14 seasons (2008-13; 2014-23) on the Griffins' blue line during his playing career, including the final three years as the team's captain, and seven campaigns (2012-15; 2016-20) with the Detroit Red Wings. Lashoff was a key component of Grand Rapids' Calder Cup championship teams in both 2013 and 2017, joining Nathan Paetsch and Mitch Callahan as the franchise's only two-time cup champions. He served as a playing captain at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, marking his first career all-star nod, and he won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2010 World Junior Championship.

The Albany, New York, native ranks second on the Griffins' all-time games played list with 628, compiling 132 points (32-100—132) and 329 penalty minutes. He's one of only four defensemen and 12 skaters to record 100 career assists for Grand Rapids, and only two Griffins blueliners have tallied more than his 132 points (Richards 238, Paetsch 142).

Lashoff has also contributed 20 points (5-15—20) and 34 PIM in 75 playoff games for Grand Rapids, marking the second-most postseason appearances in Griffins history (Paetsch 78). He also ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with two unassisted goals (T1st) and one shorthanded goal (T1st).

Lashoff became the 126th Griffins alumnus to play in the NHL when he made his debut with Detroit on Jan. 21, 2013 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, scoring a goal in the process. The defensemen accumulated 15 points (2-13—15) in 136 regular-season NHL games and logged another eight contests during the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Including a three-game stint with the ECHL's Toledo Walleye during his first full pro season in 2010-11, Lashoff played his entire career within the Red Wings organization after making his pro debut with the Griffins in 2008-09 at the age of 18. After playing junior hockey with Kingston and Barrie of the Ontario Hockey League, the undrafted Lashoff suited up for 767 professional regular-season games and registered 148 points (34-114—148) and 394 PIM.

Lashoff resides in Ada with his wife Nicolina and daughter Maeve.

ROOPE KOISTINEN

GOALTENDING COACH

The Detroit Red Wings on July 3, 2023, announced the hiring of Roope Koistinen as the goaltending coach of the Griffins.

In his first season with the team in 2023-24, Koistinen coached Sebastian Cossa to a 22-9-9 record with two shutouts to go along with a 2.41 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Under Koistinen's guidance, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in GAA (T6th) and save percentage (T13th) and set a new franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6) from Jan. 19-April 5, 2024.

Koistinen had been with Karpat's youth programs in Finland from 2014-23, serving in multiple roles for the club. In 2022-23, Karpat U20 allowed the third-fewest goals in the SM-sarja U20 league in Finland with 48 goals allowed in 23 outings (2.09 GAA) with Koistinen as its goaltending coach. The 30-year-old also garnered a 2023 U17 World Hockey Challenge bronze medal with Team Finland, serving as the team's goaltending coach. As an assistant coach for Finland's U17 team, he collected another bronze medal at the 2023 European Youth Olympic Winter Festival.

From 2015-23, the Kiiminki, Finland, native served as the goaltending coach for Karpat's U18 and U20 clubs in addition to his director of goaltending development title with Karpat. In 2018-19, Koistinen helped guide Karpat U20 to a U20 SM-liiga championship as its goaltending coach with a 32-13-5-2 ledger and just 121 goals allowed (2.33 GAA), the fewest in the league by 17 goals. In total from 2015-23, Koistinen won three league titles, four silver medals and two bronze medals with Karpat's youth programs. 
