Griffins at IceHogs

First of 12 meetings overall, first of six at the BMO Center...Tonight's game is a rematch of last year's Central Division Semifinals where the Griffins defeated the IceHogs 3-1 in the five-game series...Last season, the Griffins went 6-4-2-0 against the IceHogs...The Griffins are 19-12-4-1 (.597) since the 2020-21 season against Rockford and have outscored the IceHogs 99-93. On the road since 2020-21, Grand Rapids is 11-7-0-0 (.611) against the IceHogs and has outscored Rockford 53-50...Rockford is Grand Rapids' third-most frequent opponent (Milwaukee 221, Chicago 202), as tonight's game marks the 137th meeting between the two franchises...The Griffins and IceHogs will meet 12 times this season, the most of any Griffins' foe, with seven of those meetings coming in the final 13 games of the season...Rockford returns two of their top four scorers from last season, Cole Guttman (4th) and Brett Seney (1st), in addition to its top scoring defenseman Ethan Del Mastro. Seney tied for eighth in the AHL last year with 63 points in 68 games, while Del Mastro tied for third among the league's rookie defensemen with 37 points in 69 outings.

Last Time Out

Sebastian Cossa on Friday became the first Grand Rapids Griffins goalie to post an opening-night shutout in 26 years, as his 35 saves propelled the home team to a 3-0 victory over the Milwaukee Admirals at Van Andel Arena. After having fallen to the Admirals in last spring's Central Division Finals, the Griffins gained a measure of revenge against their rival in front of a capacity crowd of 10,834. Cossa's perfect performance was the first by a Griffin in either a season or home opener since Oct. 9, 1998, when Ian Gordon made 33 saves in a 2-0 home win over Kansas City to begin the team's third campaign in the International Hockey League. Top prospects **Marco Kasper** and **Carter Mazur** both scored goals for Grand Rapids.

The Watson Supercomputer

Dan Watson was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on June 14, 2023, and enters his second season at the helm. Last season, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory at Rockford, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign. As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 310-135-30-17 (.678) ledger during the regular season and a 56-38 (.596) mark over only six playoff campaigns.

2023-24 Season in Review

The Griffins skated in their 28th season a year ago and concluded with a 37-23-8-4 record, 86 points and a points percentage of .597. Grand Rapids finished in second place in the Central Division, its best finish since 2017-18, and defeated the Rockford IceHogs in the Central Division semifinals before being bested 3-2 in a five-game series against Milwaukee in the division finals. The team enjoyed a franchise-record 19-game home point streak (14-0-3-2) and an overall 18-game point streak (13-0-3-2), which was one-game shy of tying the franchise record. Jonatan Berggren led the team in points (56), assists (32) and goals (24), and **Carter Mazur** led the roster's rookies in points (37) and goals (17), while **Amadeus Lombardi** and **Marco Kasper** tied for the rookie lead with 21 assists. Defensively, former sixth overall pick Simon Edvinsson paced the team's blueliners with 30 points (8-22—30). In net, **Sebastian Cossa** set a franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6), and tied both the franchise record home and road point streaks of 13 home games (9-0-4) and 10 road contests (8-0-2), respectively. As a rookie, Cossa ranked among the league leaders in GAA (2.41, T6th), save percentage (.913, T13th), and wins (22, 5th among rookies).

Playoff Rematches

The Griffins will begin the season against both teams they faced in last year's Calder Cup Playoffs. Grand Rapids opened the season last night against Milwaukee, who triumphed in the Central Division Finals, before traveling to Rockford today for a rematch of the division semifinals.

Championship or Bust

Newcomer **Joe Snively** joins the Griffins after a historic run with the Hershey Bears the last two seasons. Snively has won the last two Calder Cups with Hershey and has showed a combined 33 points (6-27—33) in 40 games during the postseason with a 28-12 record in the past two playoffs. In addition to winning the cup last year, Snively also aided the Bears to a regular-season title with a 53-14-0-5 mark (111 pts., .771), the second-best regular-season record in AHL history and the most wins by an AHL team in a 72-game season. The Fairfax, Va., native logged career-high numbers in 2023-24 in games played (69), assists (45), and points (59) to go with 14 goals. Throughout his six-year AHL career with Hershey, the 28-year-old has amassed 172 points (58-114—172) and a plus-57 rating in 220 outings. Snively is in search of his third straight Calder Cup, which would put in rare AHL company, as only 11 players in league history have won three consecutive cups in the AHL and no one has reached this feat since the 1978 season.

Pure Michigan

Several Griffins will be competing in their home states this year, as the roster features four Michiganders in **Sheldon Dries** (Macomb), **Carter Mazur** (Jackson), **Dominik Shine** (Detroit), and **Austin Watson** (Ann Arbor).

Holy Goalies

The Griffins' goalie room this year will feature veteran **Malcolm Subban** and prospects **Sebastian Cossa** and **Carter Gylander**. Cossa and Subban were former first-round draft picks, as Subban was the 24th overall selection by Boston in 2012 and Cossa was the 15th overall pick by Detroit in 2021. Last season, Cossa set a franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6), and tied both the franchise record home and road point streaks of 13 home games (9-0-4) and 10 road contests (8-0-2). As a rookie, Cossa ranked among the league leaders in GAA (2.41, T6th), save percentage (.913, T13th), and wins (22, 5th among rookies). Subban spent the most time last year with Springfield (AHL) and went 11-14-4 to go with a 2.94 GAA and a .907 save percentage in 31 games. Subban, 30, has spent eight seasons in the AHL and has suited up in 206 games, showing an 89-78-32 record with a 2.65 GAA and a .911 save percentage. Subban has also spent nine campaigns in the NHL and has logged a 36-34-9 mark in 87 games with a 3.10 GAA and an .898 save percentage. Gylander begins his first year as a professional after completing four campaigns at Colgate University, compiling a 46-46-13 record with five shutouts to go along with a 2.69 GAA and a .907 save percentage in 106 games. The 23-year-old was selected with the 191st overall pick by the Red Wings in 2019.

Home Sweet Home

Under second-year head coach **Dan Watson**, the Griffins will begin a 72-game schedule when they hosted the Milwaukee Admirals in a rematch of last year's Central Division Finals during Opening Night presented by Huntington Bank. Since 2004, the Griffins are 7-3-0-1 (.682) in season openers at Van Andel Arena and have outscored their opponents 35-27. Also since 2004, Grand Rapids is 11-7-2-1 (.595) in season openers at any venue. The Griffins are 17-11-0-1 in home openers and have won seven of the last nine. The Griffins are 17-9-2-1 all time in season openers at any venue and have won three of the last four.

Roster Breakdown

Twenty-one players (forwards **Nate Danielson**, **Alex Doucet**, **Sheldon Dries**, **Cross Hanas**, **Marco Kasper**, **Amadeus Lombardi**, **Carter Mazur**, **Jakub Rychlovsky**, **Joe Snively**, **Elmer Soderblom**, and **Austin Watson**; defensemen **Shai Buium**, **Tory Dello**, **Justin Holl**, **William Lageson**, **Brogan Rafferty**, **Antti Tuomisto**, **Eemil Viro** and **William Wallinder**; goaltenders **Sebastian Cossa** and **Carter Gylander**) on the roster are under contract with the Red Wings, while four players (forwards **Hunter Johannes** and **Dominik Shine**; defenseman **Josiah Didier**; and goaltender **Malcolm Subban**) are playing on a Griffins contract. Twelve players are Red Wings draft picks (Buium, Cossa, Danielson, Gylander, Hanas, Kasper, Lombardi, Mazur, Soderblom, Tuomisto, Viro, and Wallinder).

Restocked

The Griffins lost six players who totaled 81 goals for the team last season in Jonatan Berggren (24 goals), Joel L'Esperance (16), Zach Aston-Reese (12), Matt Luff (10), Austin Czarnik (10), and Taro Hirose (9). General manager **Shawn Horcoff** is hoping that free agent signings and an up-tick in play from top prospects can replace that lost production. **Joe Snively** joins the roster after recording a career-high 59 points and 14 goals with Hershey last season, Michigan native **Sheldon Dries** showed 29 goals in 55 games with Abbotsford, and **Jakub Rychlovsky** paced the Tip-sport Extraliga in Czechia with 26 goals in 51 outings. The Griffins also have seven prospects that they'll look to for scoring in **Nate Danielson**, **Alex Doucet**, **Cross Hanas**, **Marco Kasper**, **Carter Mazur**, **Amadeus Lombardi**, and **Elmer Soderblom**.

Young Guns

The Griffins have four players who are considered rookies this season including forwards **Nate Danielson** and **Alex Doucet**, defenseman **Shai Buium**, and goaltender **Carter Gylander**.

Oldies but Goodies

The Griffins' roster features six veterans including forwards **Sheldon Dries**, **Dominik Shine** and **Austin Watson**, and defensemen **Josiah Didier**, **Justin Holl** and **William Lagesson**. A player receives veteran status if he has competed in at least 261 games in the NHL, AHL or European elite leagues. Watson leads all veterans with 750 professional games played, while Holl (583) ranks second and Didier (456) places third.

The Unknown

Jakub Rychlovsky, 23, will embark on his first campaign in North America after having spent the past four seasons in the top pro league in his home country of Czechia, in addition to playing his entire youth career with Bili Tygri Liberec. The left wing burst onto the scene last year when he paced the Tipsport Extraliga with a career-high 26 goals to go with a career-best 46 points in 51 outings. The seventh-year pro brings to North America 292 games of professional experience with 128 points (56-72—128).

Across the Atlantic We Go

The Detroit Red Wings have a rich tradition of possessing some of the top talent to come out of Sweden, such as Niklas Kronwall and Nicklas Lidstrom, and more recently Lucas Raymond. This year is no different, as the NHL franchise has sent down a handful of Swedes to the Griffins. In fact, three players are Swedish natives, including **William Lagesson**, **Elmer Soderblom** and **William Wallinder**. Grand Rapids also features **Marco Kasper**, who last season became the first-ever Austrian to compete for the Griffins, two Finnish players in **Antti Tuomisto** and **Eemil Viro**, and one player hailing from Czechia in **Jakub Rychlovsky**.

Pour Me A Draft

The Griffins' roster is stocked with high-end draft picks from previous years. The roster features five former first rounders in **Sebastian Cossa** (15th overall in 2021), **Nate Danielson** (9th overall in 2023), **Marco Kasper** (8th overall in 2022), **Malcolm Subban** (24th in 2012), and **Austin Watson** (18th in 2010). In addition, Grand Rapids is highlighted with four former second-round picks from the Red Wings, including **Shai Buium** (36th in 2021), **Cross Hanas** (55th in 2020), **Antti Tuomisto** (35th in 2019), and **William Wallinder** (32nd in 2020). The Griffins' roster also includes of one third-round pick from Detroit in **Carter Mazur** (70th in 2021) and 17 draft picks total.

Griffins in the NHL

Twenty-five former Griffins can be found on the season-opening rosters of 17 NHL teams, along with three players currently designated as injured reserve. The group includes four members of the Griffins' 2013 Calder Cup team and three players from their 2017 championship squad, including each year's playoff MVP. In addition, eight teams feature former Griffins on their coaching staffs, including two head coaches and six assistants. Only 11 of 32 NHL teams do not have a Griffins alumnus on either their roster or coaching staff.

DAN WATSON HEAD COACH

The Detroit Red Wings named Dan Watson head coach of the Griffins on June 14, 2023. Watson became the 12th head coach in franchise history after serving six seasons as head coach of the ECHL's Toledo Walleye.

In 2023-24, Watson became the ninth head coach in franchise history to lead the Griffins to the postseason during his first full season behind the bench, joining Dave Allison (1996-97), Bruce Cassidy (2000-01), Danton Cole (2002-03), Greg Ireland (2005-06), Curt Fraser (2008-09), Jeff Blashill (2012-13), Todd Nelson (2015-16) and Ben Simon (2018-19). On April 27, 2024 in a 3-2 overtime victory, he also joined seven other head coaches who won their first postseason game behind the Griffins' bench. Watson became the eighth of the last nine Griffins head coaches to win his first playoff series, defeating the Rockford IceHogs 3-1 in the 2024 Central Division Semifinals. In his first year at the helm in 2023-24, Watson led the Griffins to a second-place finish in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points, the team's best finish since the 2016-17 campaign.

The 44-year-old Watson guided Toledo to a 45-19-5-3 (0.681) record during his final season with the organization in 2022-23 before going 9-4 in the Kelly Cup Playoffs to reach the Western Conference Finals. He has been with the Red Wings organization for the past 15 seasons, holding multiple roles with the Walleye since the team's inception. An assistant coach from 2009-14, he then served two seasons (2014-16) as Toledo's associate head coach alongside head coach Derek Lalonde, who just completed his second season behind the Red Wings' bench. Watson was named head coach in July 2016 and also served as director of hockey operations during the 2020-21 ECHL campaign in which Toledo did not participate due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Watson has never missed the playoffs as head coach, reaching the Calder Cup Playoffs in his debut season last year, the Kelly Cup Finals twice (2019 and 2022) and leading Toledo to three division titles (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), three 100-point seasons (2016-17, 2017-18 and 2021-22), two regular season championships (2016-17 and 2021-22), and four Western Conference Finals berths (2017, 2019, 2022 and 2023). In 2016-17, he garnered the John Brophy Award as the ECHL's Coach of the Year in his first year as head coach, when the Walleye won the Central Division behind a franchise-record 51 wins (51-17-2-2, 0.736) and reached the

As a head coach, the Glencoe, Ontario, native possesses a 309-135-30-17 (.677) ledger during the regular season and a 56-38 (.596) mark over only six playoff campaigns (the 2020 postseason was canceled due to COVID-19). Last season with the Griffins, Watson coached two AHL All-Star Classic invites in Jonatan Berggren and Simon Edvinsson. Watson has also managed 56 future or former Griffins and nine All-ECHL Team members during his time as Toledo's head coach from 2016-23, including 2023 ECHL Goaltender of the Year John Lethemon. Over his 14-year tenure, Watson helped guide the Walleye to a 523-318-46-36 (.611) regular-season mark and Toledo reached five conference finals and two Kelly Cup Finals, all within the team's last seven playoff runs.

The fastest coach in ECHL history to reach 100 wins and the winningest head coach in Walleye history, Watson was chosen to coach in the ECHL All-Star Game in both 2017 and 2022.

An undrafted defenseman out of the Ontario Hockey League, Watson signed as a free agent with the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2000 and began his pro career with the Syracuse Crunch in 2000-01, collecting seven points (3-4—7) in 59 games. Throughout four AHL seasons with Syracuse (2000-03), the Cleveland Barons (2002-04) and Providence Bruins (2003-04), he accumulated 27 points (8-19—27) in 193 appearances.

Watson also saw action in four campaigns at the ECHL level with the Dayton Bombers (2001-02), Long Beach Ice Dogs (2004-06, as captain) and the Toledo Storm (2006-07). Watson, who was named the 2004-05 ECHL Defensive Player of the Year with the Ice Dogs, also competed in the United Hockey League with the Elmira Jackals (2000-01), Columbus Stars (2003-04) and the Kalamazoo Wings (2003-04).

Watson played his junior career with the OHL's Sarnia Sting from 1996-2000 and amassed 59 points (9-50—59) in 212 contests, appearing in the OHL All-Star Game during the 1998-99 season.

Watson and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kenzi and Eilee, and a son, Max.

STEPH JULIEN
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Steph Julien as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season with the Griffins in 2023-24, he helped guide the team to its best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. Julien then helped the Griffins reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

During the 2022-23 season, Julien was named the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL) Coach of the Year as well as the QMJHL General Manager of the Year when he helped lead the Sherbrooke Phoenix to a Central Division title and a trip to the QMJHL semifinals with a 50-13-3-2 (0.772) regular-season record. Julien also guided Canada's U18 squad to a gold medal at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup as head coach and earned another gold medal as an assistant for Team Canada at the 2023 World Junior Championship.

In 2022, Julien coached Canada's Black U17 squad to a third-place finish at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. He began his national coaching career in 2017 when he served as an assistant coach for Team Canada at the 2017 World Junior Championship, earning a silver medal.

Before joining the Griffins, Julien had spent his entire coaching career with Sherbrooke, serving as an assistant coach from 2012-16 before being named head coach midway through the 2015-16 campaign. The Shawinigan, Quebec, native garnered his first QMJHL Coach of the Year recognition during the 2019-20 campaign when Sherbrooke won the QMJHL regular-season title with a 51-8-3-1 mark (0.841). As head boss, Julien notched a 262-161-24-17 record (0.609) with three division titles and one league championship.

In 2022-23, Tyson Hinds was named the QMJHL Top Defensemen while Ethan Gauthier was named the QMJHL Top Pro Prospect under the guidance of Julien. He also propelled Joshua Roy to the top scorer in the QMJHL during the 2021-22 campaign with 119 points (51-68—119) in 66 games. In total, Julien has served as head coach for three QMJHL First All-Star Team members, four second-team honorees and three honorable mentions.

Julien also served as general manager for Sherbrooke for the past three campaigns (2020-23), accumulating a 104-47-6-6 ledger (0.675). In 2022-23, when he was named the QMJHL General Manager of the Year, Julien acquired goaltender Olivier Adam, forwards Jakub Brabenec and Jacob Melanson, and defenseman Marc-Andre Gaudet. Adam went on to show a 20-3-1 record along with a 2.09 GAA, while the skaters combined for 125 points (41-84—125) in 93 games.

The QMJHL's Defenseman of the Year in 1994-95 with the Sherbrooke Faucons, Julien was twice named a QMJHL First Team All-Star (1992-93 and 1994-95) and was selected a Second Team All-Star in 1993-94. The 49-year-old went on to collect 667 points (205-462—667) in 775 professional games from 1995-2012, playing the majority of his career overseas in Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Switzerland. He competed in one pro season in the United States with the Pensacola Ice Pilots of the ECHL, collecting 38 points (13-25—38) and 91 penalty minutes in 69 outings in 1996-97. He spent the most time in the DEL, the top hockey league in Germany, playing nine seasons and serving as captain for EHC München in the final two campaigns of his pro career from 2010-12.

Julien and his wife, Isabelle, have two daughters. Aurelie, 25, works as a nurse while Gabrielle, 23, serves as a teacher. Julien's wife, Isabelle, works as a philanthropy development director at Hospital CHUS back home in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

BRIAN LASHOFF
ASSISTANT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings announced the hiring of Brian Lashoff as an assistant coach of the Griffins on June 26, 2023.

In his first season in the coaching ranks, Lashoff helped guide the Griffins to their best finish since 2016-17, ending the season in second place in the Central Division with a 37-23-8-4 record and 86 points. He then helped the team reach the Central Division Finals for the first time since 2017.

The 34-year-old spent all or part of 14 seasons (2008-13; 2014-23) on the Griffins' blue line during his playing career, including the final three years as the team's captain, and seven campaigns (2012-15; 2016-20) with the Detroit Red Wings. Lashoff was a key component of Grand Rapids' Calder Cup championship teams in both 2013 and 2017, joining Nathan Paetsch and Mitch Callahan as the franchise's only two-time cup champions. He served as a playing captain at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, marking his first career all-star nod, and he won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2010 World Junior Championship.

The Albany, New York, native ranks second on the Griffins' all-time games played list with 628, compiling 132 points (32-100—132) and 329 penalty minutes. He's one of only four defensemen and 12 skaters to record 100 career assists for Grand Rapids, and only two Griffins blueliners have tallied more than his 132 points (Richards 238, Paetsch 142).

Lashoff has also contributed 20 points (5-15—20) and 34 PIM in 75 playoff games for Grand Rapids, marking the second-most postseason appearances in Griffins history (Paetsch 78). He also ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with two unassisted goals (T1st) and one shorthanded goal (T1st).

Lashoff became the 126th Griffins alumnus to play in the NHL when he made his debut with Detroit on Jan. 21, 2013 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, scoring a goal in the process. The defensemen accumulated 15 points (2-13—15) in 136 regular-season NHL games and logged another eight contests during the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Including a three-game stint with the ECHL's Toledo Walleye during his first full pro season in 2010-11, Lashoff played his entire career within the Red Wings organization after making his pro debut with the Griffins in 2008-09 at the age of 18. After playing junior hockey with Kingston and Barrie of the Ontario Hockey League, the undrafted Lashoff suited up for 767 professional regular-season games and registered 148 points (34-114—148) and 394 PIM.

Lashoff resides in Ada with his wife Nicolina and daughter Maeve.

ROOPE KOISTINEN

GOALTENDING DEVELOPMENT COACH

The Detroit Red Wings on July 3, 2023, announced the hiring of Roope Koistinen as the goaltending development coach of the Griffins.

In his first season with the team in 2023-24, Koistinen coached Sebastian Cossa to a 22-9-9 record with two shutouts to go along with a 2.41 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Under Koistinen's guidance, Cossa ranked among the AHL leaders in GAA (T6th) and save percentage (T13th) and set a new franchise record with a 19-game point streak (13-0-6) from Jan. 19-April 5, 2024.

Koistinen had been with Karpat's youth programs in Finland from 2014-23, serving in multiple roles for the club. 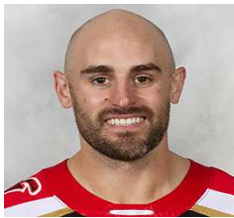
