TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (40-24-3-0) open up a three-game weekend and their final road trip of the season tonight against the Grand Rapids Griffins (34-26-4-2) at Van Andel Arena.

On the heels of a perfect 5-O-O road trip from the Mar. 21-29 the last time the Stars traveled, Texas returned home last week for a four-game homestand at the H-E-B Center. Goals were hard to come by, as the Stars suffered 4-1 and 6-2 losses to the lowa Wild on Apr. 1-2, followed by 2-1 and 3-1 losses last Saturday and Sunday against the Milwaukee Admirals.

Grand Rapids enters the final two games of the season series looking for their first home win against the Stars, who have taken the first two meetings in Michigan. The Griffins swept Rockford last Friday and Saturday, 8-3 and 7-5.


PREVIOUS GAME

The Texas Stars suffered a 3-1 loss to the Milwaukee Admirals last Sunday in the final game of a four-game homestand in six days.

Midway through the first period, Admirals forward Grigori Denisenko tipped a point shot from Kevin Gravel into the net from the edge of the crease. It was the only goal of the first period, as Matt Murray stopped all 15 Texas shots he faced in the frame.

Neither team managed to score in the second period, as the Stars narrowly outshot the Admirals again, but couldn't solve Murray. Remi Poirier stopped all eight shots he faced in the stanza, and finished the game with 19 saves.

Denisenko cleaned up a rebound on a 3-on-1 rush to add insurance to Milwaukee's lead, which eventually was his second consecutive game-winning goal. Texas found the net on a third period power play, when **Justin Hryckowian** tipped a point shot from **Matej Blumel** with 6:15 remaining, but the Admirals got an empty-net goal from Ozzy Wiesblatt to complete the scoring and the weekend sweep.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Stars defenseman Kyle Capobianco became the team's first player to reach 40 assists this season when he tallied one in the third period of Sunday's game against Milwaukee. Already one of seven Texas skaters with over 40 points (5-40=45), Capobianco ranks seventh among AHL defensemen in points (45). He also ranks sixth in plus/minus rating (+25), and third in assists (40), which is just two assists shy of his career-best from the 2023-24 season.

ROAD WARRIORS

Texas finishes its road schedule this weekend, with three games in three days. The team enters tonight's contest riding a five-game road winning streak, after putting together a perfect 5-O-O stretch from Mar. 21-29. It's the second such winning streak the Stars have managed this season, after setting a franchise record with 10 consecutive road wins from Dec. 8, 2024 - Jan. 26, 2025. Since that Dec. 8 win at Lee's Family Forum against the Henderson Silver Knights, the Stars are 17-4-O in enemy territory. With 22 road victories this season, the Stars have matched the second most in team history (22 in 2009-10) and are three shy of the team record (25 in 2012-13). Only two AHL teams have more this season (Hershey and Rochester - 23).

FINDING THE NET

Goals were hard to come by during the Stars' recent homestand, as the team scored just five total in the four games last week. Texas, however, has been one of the league's top-scoring teams all season, averaging 3.37 per game, which ranks fifth overall. When scoring three or more goals in a game, the Stars are 40-7-1, while boasting a 31-3-1 record when netting four or more.

Leading the Stars (and the league) in scoring is **Matej Blumel**, who set a single-season franchise record with his 38th of the year Mar. 29 at Cleveland. Blumel had five goals during the team's five-game road trip at the end of last month. Nine different Texas skaters have scored double-digit goals this season, including four that have at least 20 (Blumel, **Arttu Hyry** - 24, **Cameron Hughes** - 21, and **Justin Hryckowian** - 20).

REMARKABLE ROOKIE

Texas Stars forward **Justin Hryckowian** continues to lead all AHL rookies with 57 points (20-37=57) in 63 games this season. The Northeastern University alum tied 2023-24 Rookie of the Year, **Logan Stankoven**'s total (57), on Sunday, matching the second-most points any Texas player has produced in their debut season. **Curtis McKenzie** has the team rookie record, after posting 65 points during the 2013-14 campaign. Both Stankoven and McKenzie won their season's Dudley "Red" Garrett Memorial Award as the league's Most Outstanding Rookie. Three different Stars have received that honor through the team's first 15 seasons, including **Riley Damiani** in 2020-21.

ON THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

The Stars and Griffins have met on April 11th before. On this date seven years ago, Texas hosted Grand Rapids at the H-E-B Center at Cedar Park and pulled off a 3-2 overtime win, thanks to the heroics of **Travis Morin** just 1:44 into the extra frame.

Denis Gurianov opened the scoring 8:47 into the second period and **Greg Rallo** pushed the Stars' lead to 2-0 less than three minutes later. All four goals in regulation came during the middle stanza, as Dan Renouf and Brian Lashoff netted the Griffins' goals just 2:36 apart to tie the game. After a scoreless third period, Morin's 10th goal of the season broke the tie in overtime.

STARS / GRIFFINS CONNECTIONS

- Griffins forward **Sheldon Dries** had 30 points (19-11=30) in 70 games as a rookie with Texas in 2017-18 and chipped in 10 goals in 22 playoff games during the Stars' run to the 2018 Calder Cup Finals.
- Stars goaltender **Magnus Hellberg** appeared in four games for Grand Rapids during the 2022-23 season, going 2-2-0 with a 2.50 GAA and .932 SV%.
- Hellberg and Griffins forward **Austin Watson** were teammates with the Milwaukee Admirals from 2012-15, as both were drafted by Nashville a year apart.
- .Grand Rapids goaltender **Jack Campbell** was drafted 11th overall by Dallas in 2010, played 122 games with Texas from 2012-16 with a 56-43-16 record, and appeared in four playoff games the year the Stars won the 2014 Calder Cup.
- Texas forward **Kole Lind** and Grand Rapids defenseman **Brogan Rafferty** have crossed paths twice as teammates, first with the 2019-20 Utica Comets, and second with the 2022-23 Coachella Valley Firebirds, who won the Western Conference.
- Defensemen **Josiah Didier** of the Griffins and **Alex Petrovic** of the Stars were on a team together with Providence in the AHL in 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Chase Wheatcroft** and Griffins forward **Ondrej Becher** were teammates on the WHL's Prince George Cougars in 2022-23.

NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (6th Season)



Neil Graham is in his sixth season as head coach of the Texas Stars after leading the team to three straight Calder Cup Playoff appearances. He was promoted from assistant coach to head coach on December 10, 2019 and earned his first win the next night, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2-2 record. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, his first time coaching at the American Hockey League level.

Graham, 39, led the Stars to the 2022 Calder Cup Playoffs, their first postseason appearance since 2018, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He then guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals. The Stars again qualified for the playoffs in 2023-24 and swept Manitoba in the opening round. During his tenure, Graham has coached two AHL Rookie of the Year winners (Riley Damiani, 2021, and Logan Stankoven, 2024), as well as the league's scoring champion and MVP (Mavrik Bourque, 2024). Before making the move to Cedar Park, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons, guiding the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four seasons at the helm. Prior to being appointed head coach on Aug. 7, 2015, Graham served as Steelheads assistant coach for two seasons, after a role as a player/coach during the 2012-13 campaign. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League,

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (6th Season)



Travis Morin is in his sixth season working alongside Neil Graham on the Texas Stars bench. He was promoted to assistant coach on December 10, 2019 after previously being named the team's Skills Coach and Director of Business Development on July 31, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for two games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 40, ended his playing career following the 2018-19 season, after 10 years with the Stars organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games.

Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the ECHL's South Carolina Stingrays and AHL's Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (4th Season)



Max Fortunus is in his fourth season as assistant coach of the Texas Stars, after he was named to the staff on May 20, 2021. The former Stars defenseman returned to Cedar Park, following a 17-year playing career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent in Texas, including a three-year stint as team captain.

Fortunus, 41, previously spent his final three playing seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21. Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named an assistant captain for the 2011-12 campaign before serving as Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks fourth in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fifth in assists (123), and sixth in points (167), leading all club defensemen in each category. Fortunus made 10 trips to the Calder Cup Playoffs in his AHL career, logging 31 points (6-25=31) in 118 career AHL postseason games. Of his 10 career playoff appearances, five came with Texas, recording 15 points (2-13=15) in 63 Calder Cup Playoff games in a Texas sweater. Fortunus captained the Stars to the 2014 Calder Cup Championship, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1).

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (4th Season)



Ryan Daniels is in his fourth season as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars. He was hired on June 8, 2021 and has worked with several Stars goaltending prospects, including NHL All-Star Jake Oettinger.

Daniels, 36, previously spent three years with the Ontario Hockey League's Guelph Storm, who captured the 2019 league championship and a spot in the 2019 Memorial Cup. He joined Guelph after three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to his time in major juniors, Daniels was the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, the back-to-back Buckland Cup OJHL champions in 2014 and 2015.


Daniels was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006 and played five seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes, where he accumulated 85 wins in 166 games. He was also a four-year varsity goaltender for Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was a 2nd Team All-Canadian and a two-time OUA West MVP.

JOSH JOHNSON - Video Coach (2nd Season)



Josh Johnson is in his second season as the Texas Stars video coach. He was hired in the summer of 2023 after spending two seasons as the director of hockey operations for the University of St. Thomas men's hockey program. While at UST from 2021-23, he oversaw the Tommies' video coordination and analytics, community outreach and travel arrangements. Johnson previously served as the video coordinator for Robert Morris University in 2020-21, where he handled practice and game film, video breakdown and analytics.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
