TONIGHT'S GAME

The Texas Stars (1-0 in the postseason) continue their Calder Cup Playoff run tonight against the Grand Rapids Griffins (0-1) in Game Two of the best-of-five Central Division Semifinals at Van Andel Arena.

Seeded second in the division, Texas is making its fourth consecutive trip to the postseason and 11th all-time, while they're only matching up against Grand Rapids in the playoffs for the second time ever. The Stars rolled to a victory in Game One, thanks to four goals in the first 40 minutes and a stellar performance by **Remi Poirier** in net, blanking the Griffins 4-0.

The Griffins earned third place ahead of Chicago on the final night of the regular season, with a 2-1 shootout win against the Iowa Wild in Des Moines.

PREVIOUS GAME

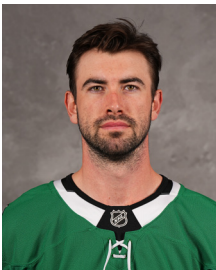
The Texas Stars kicked off their Calder Cup Playoff run with a 4-0 shutout victory over the Grand Rapids Griffins in Game One of the best-of-five Central Division Semifinals last Tuesday night at Van Andel Arena.

Texas struck early, with **Kyle Capobianco** scoring the Stars' first goal of the postseason just 3:40 into the game. Just three minutes later, **Curtis McKenzie** doubled the lead when **Matej Blumel** found him on the backdoor, and McKenzie finished off the 2-on-1 rush with a goal to make it 2-0 heading into the first intermission.

The Stars extended their lead with two more goals in the second period. **Kole Lind** made it 3-0 at 5:30, scoring on the power play from between the circles. Less than four minutes later, **Emilio Pettersen** redirected a point shot from **Tommy Bergsland** past Sebastian Cossa to stretch the lead to 4-0, forcing the Griffins to make a goaltending change.

Remi Poirier was flawless between the pipes, turning aside all 29 shots he faced. Cossa took the loss for the Griffins, surrendering four goals on 19 shots before being replaced by Jack Campbell, who stopped all 11 shots he faced in relief.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT



Stars defenseman **Kyle Capobianco** scored the game-winning goal on Tuesday night against Grand Rapids, just under four minutes into the first period. It was the blueliner's first career postseason goal. Capobianco ended the regular season with a team-leading +25 rating, ten points higher than the next skater (**Justin Hryckowian** - +15). In 64 games, he scored seven goals and earned 43 assists to end the regular season with 50 points.

HEAD-TO-HEAD

Tonight marks the second of a best-of-five Division Semifinal series, which begins with Games One and Two in Grand Rapids, before the series shifts to Cedar Park for Game Three and Games Four and Five, if necessary, May 9, 10 and 12.

The Stars won five of the eight meetings against the Griffins in the regular season, including three of four games at Van Andel Arena. Texas won 3-2 on Dec. 22, thanks to an **Arttu Hyry** overtime goal. **Magnus Hellberg** earned a 4-0 shutout on Mar. 26, and **Kole Lind** netted a hat trick in a 4-1 win Apr. 12. The teams also split two different two-game series Dec. 17-18 and Feb. 25-26 in Cedar Park.

SERIES HISTORY

Texas and Grand Rapids have met 88 times in history, with the Stars holding a 43-36-7-2 all-time record.

The Stars carry a 19-19-3-2 record all-time at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids entering tonight's matchup, after the Griffins took three of four contests in 2023-24 on their home ice.

The Griffins hold a 284-276 goal differential all-time against the Stars.

The teams first faced off on Oct. 15, 2009 where Stars goalie Matt Climie earned the first shutout in franchise history, a 2-0 victory in Cedar Park.

NEWS & NOTES

RECORD BREAKERS

The 2024-25 regular season was one of the Texas Stars' most successful in their 16 seasons in the AHL, featuring several team and individual records being reset along the way. The Stars smashed a franchise record for consecutive road wins, with a 10-game winning streak from Dec. 8 - Jan. 26 this season. Texas also matched its record for consecutive penalty kills, when the team killed off 39 in a row from Dec. 18 - Jan. 29.

Matej Blumel set the team's single-season scoring record with 39 goals, passing a 13-year record set by Matt Fraser (2011-12), who had 37. That also earned Blumel the AHL's Willie Marshall Award as the top goal scorer in the league this season. Blumel's 274 shots on goal were also the most in a single season in team history. Defenseman **Kyle Capobianco** cruised past the team record for assists by a defenseman (43) in a single season, previously held by Will Butcher (2022-23) and Derrick Pouliot (2023-24), who had 37 each. AHL Rookie of the Year **Justin Hryckowian** posted a 60-point season (22-38=60), which is the most by any undrafted rookie in Texas history.

BATTLE TESTED

Three different Stars players have been multiple trips to the Calder Cup Finals in their AHL career, including captain **Curtis McKenzie**, who has done so three times. The 12th-year-pro helped the Stars win the 2014 Calder Cup as a rookie, led Texas back to the 2018 Finals as a first-year captain, and returned to the 2019 Finals as a member of the Chicago Wolves. McKenzie has 65 points (30-36=66) in 91 career playoff games.

Meanwhile, two of the Stars' prized free agent acquisitions last summer are fresh off of back-to-back trips to Finals. **Cameron Hughes** and **Kole Lind** were big contributors to the Coachella Valley Firebirds' teams that reached the 2023 and 2024 Finals, and are looking for a third straight trip with their new team. Hughes had 39 points (4-35=39) in 44 playoff games for the Firebirds, while Lind put up 42 points (14-28=42) in 44 games with Coachella.

STARS OF THE SERIES

Several Stars players stepped up throughout the eight-game season series against Grand Rapids, as Texas won five of the eight meetings. **Matej Blumel** led the way with 11 points (6-5=11), followed closely by **Arttu Hyry**, who had 10 points (5-5=10). Hyry scored two game-winners against the Griffins, including an overtime goal Dec. 22 at Van Andel Arena. **Kole Lind** had 7 points (3-4=7), thanks to his Apr. 12 hat trick in Michigan, while **Justin Hryckowian** provided 6 points (3-3=6). **Cameron Hughes** (2-1=3) is the only other Stars skater to score multiple goals in the series, including an overtime winner in Cedar Park.

ON THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

The Stars earned a 3-2 victory over the Chicago Wolves in Game 3 of the West Division Finals on May 5, 2010, at Cedar Park Center, taking a 2-1 series lead during their inaugural 2009-10 season.

Travis Morin led the way with two goals for Texas. He scored his first early in the opening period, which ended in a 1-1 tie. After a scoreless second, Morin found the net again 6:03 into the third to give the Stars the lead. Chicago responded just minutes later to knot the game once more. With 6:17 remaining in regulation, **Dan Jancevski** capitalized on a power play to bury the eventual game-winner. Goaltender **Brent Krahn** turned aside 21 of 23 shots to seal the victory for Texas.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">Griffins forward Sheldon Dries had 30 points (19-11=30) in 70 games as a rookie with Texas in 2017-18 and chipped in 10 goals in 22 playoff games during the Stars' run to the 2018 Calder Cup Finals.Stars goaltender Magnus Hellberg appeared in four games for Grand Rapids during the 2022-23 season, going 2-2-0 with a 2.50 GAA and .932 SV%.Hellberg and Griffins forward Austin Watson were teammates with the Milwaukee Admirals from 2012-15, as both were drafted by Nashville a year apart.Grand Rapids goaltender Jack Campbell was drafted 11th overall by Dallas in 2010, played 122 games with Texas from 2012-16 with a 56-43-16 record, and appeared in four playoff games the year the Stars won the 2014 Calder Cup.Texas forward Kole Lind and Grand Rapids defenseman Brogan Rafferty have crossed paths twice as teammates, first with the 2019-20 Utica Comets, and second with the 2022-23 Coachella Valley Firebirds, who won the Western Conference. Cameron Hughes was also a member of that Firebirds team.Defensemen Josiah Didier of the Griffins and Alex Petrovic of the Stars were on a team together with Providence in the AHL in 2019-20.Stars forward Chase Wheatcroft and Griffins forward Ondrej Becher were teammates on the WHL's Prince George Cougars in 2022-23.

2024-25 COACHING STAFF



NEIL GRAHAM - Head Coach (6th Season)



Neil Graham is in his sixth season as head coach of the Texas Stars after leading the team to three straight Calder Cup Playoff appearances. He was promoted from assistant coach to head coach on December 10, 2019 and earned his first win the next night, a 3-1 victory over Manitoba. He went on to finish the shortened season with an 18-15-2 record. Graham was previously hired as assistant coach of the Stars on July 8, 2019, his first time coaching at the American Hockey League level.

Graham, 39, led the Stars to the 2022 Calder Cup Playoffs, their first postseason appearance since 2018, ending with a first round loss to Rockford. He then guided Texas to the top of the Central Division in 2022-23, as the Stars won their first division title since 2014. The Stars swept Rockford in the 2023 division semifinals before coming up just short against Milwaukee in the division finals. The Stars again qualified for the playoffs in 2023-24 and swept Manitoba in the opening round. During his tenure, Graham has coached two AHL Rookie of the Year winners (Riley Damiani, 2021, and Logan Stankoven, 2024), as well as the league's scoring champion and MVP (Mavrik Bourque, 2024). Before making the move to Cedar Park, he served as head coach of the Idaho Steelheads, the ECHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars, from 2015 to 2019. Over that span, he amassed a 166-91-31 record in 288 regular-season contests and led Idaho to three consecutive 40-win seasons, guiding the Steelheads to the Kelly Cup Playoffs in all four seasons at the helm. Prior to being appointed head coach on Aug. 7, 2015, Graham served as Steelheads assistant coach for two seasons, after a role as a player/coach during the 2012-13 campaign. The Calgary, Alberta native is a graduate of Mercyhurst University where he played four seasons before turning pro. Graham recorded 60 points (23-37=60) and 128 penalty minutes over 137 NCAA games. He turned pro in 2010 and split three seasons between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League, accruing 98 points (42-56=98) in 113 professional games.

TRAVIS MORIN - Assistant Coach (6th Season)



Travis Morin is in his sixth season working alongside Neil Graham on the Texas Stars bench. He was promoted to assistant coach on December 10, 2019 after previously being named the team's Skills Coach and Director of Business Development on July 31, 2019. During the shortened 2019-2020 season, Morin stepped in for Head Coach Neil Graham for two games and recorded a win in his debut commanding the bench, a 5-4 victory against Colorado on March 10, 2020.

Morin, 40, ended his playing career following the 2018-19 season, after 10 years with the Stars organization and 12 professional seasons overall. Morin retired as the Stars franchise leader in points (560), goals (175), assists (385), and games played (686). On Oct. 19, 2019, he became the first player in team history to have his jersey number (#23) retired. His 686 games played with the Stars are the most by any AHL player with one organization since 1974. The Brooklyn Park, Minnesota native captained the team during the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons, was a four-time AHL All-Star, and led the Stars in scoring across five of his 10 seasons. He was a focal point of Texas' 2014 Calder Cup Championship season, capturing the Les Cunningham Award (AHL MVP), John B. Sollenberger Award (Regular Season Scoring Leader), and Jack A. Butterfield Award (Calder Cup Playoff MVP) that season. Morin is also the organization's most decorated postseason scorer, earning 64 points (23-42=64) in 87 playoff games. Morin is a graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato where he played all four years before turning pro in 2007. Across 151 games at his alma mater, Morin recorded 133 points (58-75=133) and served as team captain in his senior season of 2006-07. Before joining the Stars, he also played for the ECHL's South Carolina Stingrays and AHL's Hershey Bears from 2007 to 2009.

MAX FORTUNUS - Assistant Coach (4th Season)



Max Fortunus is in his fourth season as assistant coach of the Texas Stars, after he was named to the staff on May 20, 2021. The former Stars defenseman returned to Cedar Park, following a 17-year playing career that spanned more than 1,100 regular season games in the NHL, AHL, DEL, and ECHL. Six of those seasons were spent in Texas, including a three-year stint as team captain.

Fortunus, 41, previously spent his final three playing seasons with Fischtown of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL), Germany's top professional hockey league. He recorded 50 points (7-43=50) in 139 career DEL games with Fischtown, serving as an assistant captain for all three seasons with the club from 2018-21. Fortunus spent 15 seasons in the AHL where he amassed 286 points (76-210=286) in 882 career games with Houston, Manitoba, Texas, Iowa and Springfield. The former defenseman recorded 167 points (44-123=167) in 402 career games with Texas over six seasons from 2009-15. Fortunus was named an assistant captain for the 2011-12 campaign before serving as Texas' captain from 2012-15. He ranks fourth in Texas Stars history in games played (402), fifth in assists (123), and sixth in points (167), leading all club defensemen in each category. Fortunus made 10 trips to the Calder Cup Playoffs in his AHL career, logging 31 points (6-25=31) in 118 career AHL postseason games. Of his 10 career playoff appearances, five came with Texas, recording 15 points (2-13=15) in 63 Calder Cup Playoff games in a Texas sweater. Fortunus captained the Stars to the 2014 Calder Cup Championship, while he also reached the Calder Cup Final in 2009 with Manitoba and again in 2010 with Texas. He was also named to the 2014-15 AHL All-Star Game. The native of La Prairie, Quebec, appeared in nine career NHL contests with Dallas during the 2009-10 and 2013-14 seasons, recording one assist (0-1=1).

RYAN DANIELS - Goaltending Coach (4th Season)



Ryan Daniels is in his fourth season as the Goaltender Development Coach of the Texas Stars. He was hired on June 8, 2021 and has worked with several Stars goaltending prospects, including NHL All-Star Jake Oettinger.

Daniels, 36, previously spent three years with the Ontario Hockey League's Guelph Storm, who captured the 2019 league championship and a spot in the 2019 Memorial Cup. He joined Guelph after three seasons as the Goaltending Coach for the Mississauga Steelheads, who won the Eastern Conference Championship in 2016-17. Prior to his time in major juniors, Daniels was the Goaltending Coach for the Toronto Patriots of the OJHL, the back-to-back Buckland Cup OJHL champions in 2014 and 2015.

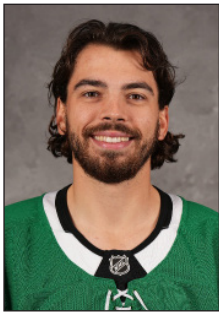
Daniels was drafted by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round in 2006 and played five seasons in the OHL for the Saginaw Spirit and Peterborough Petes, where he accumulated 85 wins in 166 games. He was also a four-year varsity goaltender for Wilfrid Laurier University, where he was a 2nd Team All-Canadian and a two-time OUA West MVP.

The Ludington, Michigan native earned a sport management degree from the University of Michigan in 2020, where he also served as an analytics and video assistant for the Wolverines men's hockey program.
